**A. Proposal to Approve the Daylight/Twilight High School Summer School Program 2019**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Daylight/Twilight High School Summer School Program 2019 at the Hanover Campus. The program will ensure students are processing through their graduation requirements in a compliant manner. Improving students' academic skills will allow seniors to graduate in August. Potential juniors will have a chance to accumulate credits to graduate with their 2020 cohort. July 1, 2019 through August 9, 2019; cost not to exceed \$9,868.00; GAAP code 15-120-100-610-0000-00-35, 15-190-100-610-0050-00-05.

**B. Proposal to Approve the Daylight/Twilight High School Summer Guidance Registration and Orientation Team 2019**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Daylight/Twilight High School Summer Guidance Registration and Orientation Team 2019. Summer registration and the course selection process will ensure students begin the academic school year with a schedule reflective of their previous academic history. August 15, 2019 through August 31, 2019; cost not to exceed \$3,888.00; GAAP code 15-140-100-101-0009-00-35.

**C. Proposal to Approve the Princeton University STEM Summer Institute**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Princeton University STEM Summer Institute. QUEST is offering a two-week summer institute and a four-day field based program in collaboration with the NJ Pinelands Preservation Alliance on the Princeton University campus. Science teachers selected by Princeton University will attend the Summer Institute and implement standards and activities in class. Teachers who participate in the program will complete a survey before and after the Institute, a follow up survey during the summer of 2020, attend and participate in two-year focus group sessions. No cost to the Board.

Dunn MS will establish accelerated, resource and integrated classes within the scope of the TPS course catalog that allows students a choice. The school Scheduling Teams using student data and IEPs will adjust schedules to allow for placement in classes more appropriately suited to the students' needs and strengths. August 15, 2019 through September 15, 2019; cost not to exceed \$900.00; GAAP code 15-130-100-101-0009-00-10.

Hedgepeth/Williams MS will establish accelerated, resource and integrated classes within the scope of the TPS course catalog that allows students a choice. The school Scheduling Teams using student data and IEPs will adjust schedules to allow for placement in classes more appropriately suited to

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the students' needs and strengths. August 15, 2019 through September 15, 2019; cost not to exceed \$864.00; GAAP code 15-130-100-101-0009-00-08.

**G. Proposal to Approve the Scheduling Team for Rivera Middle School**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Scheduling Team for Rivera Middle School. Rivera Middle School will establish accelerated, resource and integrated classes within the scope of the TPS course catalog that allows students a choice. The school Scheduling Teams using student data and IEPs will adjust schedules to allow for placement in classes more appropriately suited to the students' needs and strengths. August 15, 2019 through September 15, 2019; cost not to exceed \$1080.00; GAAP code 15-130-100-101-0009-00-15.

**H. Proposal to Approve the Grace A. Dunn Middle School 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Dinner Dance**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Grace A. Dunn Middle School 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Dinner Dance. Students who are passing the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and have not been suspended or failing are eligible to participate in the Dinner Dance upon paying for their ticket. Parents will drive the students to the dance and pick them up from the dance; no cost to the Board.

**I. Proposal to Approve the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Bridge to TNGA Summer Program/Academic Support for Failing and CUSP 8<sup>th</sup> Graders**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Bridge to TNGA Summer Program/Academic Support for Failing and CUSP 8<sup>th</sup> Graders. Based on current MP 3 Power School Data, there are approximately 60 – 80 students in danger of failing 2 or more content courses and/or have a Y1 average of 60–65 in Math/ELA across all four middle schools. The program will assist with preparing all rising 9<sup>th</sup> graders with the prerequisite skills needed to be successful in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade. August 6, 2019 through August 29, 2019; cost not to exceed \$15,000.00; GAAP code 15-422-100-101-0009-00-04

**J. Proposal to Approve TCHS Summer Program**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the TCHS Summer Program to be housed at The Ninth Grade Academy. Students will have the opportunity to make up courses that allow them to complete their graduation requirements and/or be promoted to the next grade level. July 1, 2019 through August 15, 2019; cost not to exceed \$51,000.00; GAAP codes 15-422-100-101-0009-00-05 and 15-190-100-320-0000-00-05

**K. Proposal to Approve the Scheduling Team for Joyce Kilmer Middle School**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Scheduling Team for Joyce Kilmer Middle School. Joyce Kilmer MS will establish accelerated, resource and integrated classes within the scope of the TPS course catalog that allows students a choice. The school Scheduling Teams using student data and IEPs will adjust schedules to allow for placement in classes more appropriately suited to the students' needs and strengths. August 15, 2019 through August 30, 2019; cost not to exceed \$3,600.00; GAAP code 15-130-100-101-0009-00-24.

**L. Proposal to Approve the Columbus Open Gym/Performance Training**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Columbus Open Gym/Performance Training. Trenton Tornado Basketball Team will participate in daily mini clinics after school to build the aerobic base and further develop overall basketball skills. Adequate time will be spent on individual position and group training, including five on five play and special games as well as team-oriented practices. All

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participating students attend Trenton Public Schools. May 29, 2019 through June 14, 2019; no cost to the Board.

**M. Proposal to Approve Amplify Science Pilot including Professional Development– Rivera, Kilmer, Hedgepeth/Williams and Dunn Middle Schools at the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Level**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves Amplify Science – Rivera, Kilmer, Hedgepeth/Williams and Dunn Middle Schools as a pilot this school year. In order for students and teachers to succeed, teachers need training, licenses, supplies and professional development. Amplify Science blends hands-on investigations, literacy rich activities and interactive digital tools to empower students to think, read, write and argue like real scientists and engineers. 2019-20 SY; cost not to exceed \$205,000; GAAP code 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81.

**N. Proposal to Approve the Progressive Science Initiative (PSI) – Rivera, Kilmer Hedgepeth/Williams, Dunn Middle School for 8<sup>th</sup> Grade (Physics) and 9<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> grade.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Progressive Science Initiative (PSI) – Hedgepeth/Williams MS, Dunn MS and 9th Grade Academy. PSI is currently our core science resource. Professional development for middle school teachers will focus on increasing student engagement, constructed responses and the eight science and engineering practices. Professional development for high school teachers will focus on reducing student failure rates, constructed responses and the eight science and engineering practices. 2019-20 SY; cost not to exceed \$32,000.00; GAAP code 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81.

**O. Proposal to Approve Micronix Systems, Inc.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves Micronix Systems, Inc. High school microscopes need cleaning and repair. Micronix performs these services. Micronix offers a wide variety of new and used instruments and accessories for purchase or rentals. Recommendation for Micronix to be approved as a district vendor to perform this service.

**P. Proposal to Approve the New Jersey Center for Teaching and Learning – AP Physics C Professional Development.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the New Jersey Center for Teaching and Learning – AP Physics C Professional Development. The secondary STEM supervisor will implement Physics C for students who take Calculus to have more AP opportunities. **Q. Proposal to Approve Project Lead the Way – 2019-23 STEM Program Adoption**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves Project Lead the Way – 2019-20 STEM Program Adoption. Students need access to STEM programs that lead to college and career pathways. Additionally, the NJDOE requires all high schools to offer a computer science course. Project Lead the Way offers courses recognized by colleges and universities in the fields of Computer Science. The program's interdisciplinary courses engage students in compelling, real-world challenges. As students work together to design solutions, they learn computational thinking, not just how to code, and become better thinkers and communicators. 2019-20 SY; cost not to exceed; \$17,585.75; SY 2020-21; cost not to exceed \$11,455.30; GAAP codes 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81, 11-000-221-110-0009-00-81, 11-000-221-610-0000-00-81.

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**R. Proposal to Approve Agile Minds Math PD**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves Agile Minds Math PD. All high schools are adopting Agile Minds Math program beginning September 2019. In order for students and teachers to succeed in using Agile Minds, teachers need training in the adopted program. Teachers will receive training in how to teach Agile Minds using both the textbooks and the software. After training, teachers will implement Agile Minds in their classroom; July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020; cost not to exceed \$174,000; GAAP Code: 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81.

**S. Proposal to Approve Agile Minds 2019-20 Textbook/Program**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves Agile Minds 2019-20 Textbook/Program. Agile Minds Programs, tools and services empower educators and learners to do the work of teaching and learning more effectively. Agile Minds provide teachers and students access to resources aligned to the NJSLs and an increase in student performance on state assessments. 2019-20 SY; cost not to exceed \$79,083.00; GAAP code 11-000-221-610-0000-00-81.

**T. Proposal to Approve Carnegie Math PD by Carnegie Learning (June 2019)**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves Carnegie Math PD by Carnegie Learning (June 2019). Carnegie Learning was awarded an RFP to provide Algebraic Reasoning Pedagogy to TPS Math Teachers. Teachers will receive training in how to use mathematical practices to improve instruction in the areas of Algebra and Functions. After training, teachers will implement strategies in their classrooms during the 2019-20 school year. June 17 through 19, 2019/ June 24 through 27, 2019; cost not to exceed \$90,400.00; GAAP Code 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81

**U. Proposal to Approve Carnegie Math PD by Carnegie Learning 2019-20 SY**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves Carnegie Math PD by Carnegie Learning 2019-20 SY. All four middle schools are going into their second year of Carnegie Math. Teachers will receive training in how to teach Carnegie Math using both textbooks and software. One math specialist dedicated to Trenton will come to each middle school a minimum of twenty times during the school year. 2019-20 SY; cost not to exceed \$204,000.00; GAAP code 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81

**V. Proposal to Approve E-Dynamic Learning 2019-20 SY; Agilix Brain Honey – CTE Curriculum for TNGA, TCHS and all Middle Schools.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves E-Dynamic Learning - 2019-20 SY; Agilix Brain Honey – CTE Curriculum. E-Dynamic Learning provides programs for students that teachers can facilitate and lead students to receiving certificates. Students will be provided for CTE programs. BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Adoption of Discovery Education’s Techbook as the core instructional resource for social studies, grades 6 through 8, for the 2019-20 SY. With a focus on developing disciplinary and digital literacy, the resource provides dynamic, next-generation learning experiences through a robust library of primary and secondary sources. Academic and domain-specific vocabulary are key program components that foster content understanding. Keeping our students’ needs first, every Techbook may be translated to Spanish with the click of a button. This includes professional development and support for all middle school social teachers of general, ESL, and special education students. High school students graduating from a PLLS participant high school, who are fully admissible to GCU (not Accepted with Specifications), will receive a minimum institutional award package of \$3,250 per academic year. The total GCU award package could be higher based upon a student's level of academic merit, program of study, registration date, and other offers for incoming students including those related to participation in athletics, pep band, theater, debate, etc. The effective tuition rates would not exceed \$13,250 per academic year after the minimum GCU scholarship package is applied. The high school must be a PLLS participant on or before the August 1st\* immediately following the student's graduation in order for the student to be eligible for the \$3,250 minimum award.
2. PLLS participants will have access to a 10% scholarship for their faculty, staff, and governing board members (subject to district policies). Spouses will receive a 5% scholarship.
3. A 15% scholarship is available to PLLS employees employed as paraprofessionals entering an online Bachelor's program through the College of Education or a Secondary Education Emphasis degree program.
4. Students' parents will receive a 5% scholarship providing savings toward online undergraduate, graduate or doctoral degree programs related to the field of Education through the University's College of Education. Parents are eligible for the scholarship if the student is actively enrolled in a school with a PLLS agreement in effect. Parents of students who attended a high school while a PLLS agreement was in effect and who are actively attending GCU will also be eligible for the scholarship.
5. PLLS participants will have access to GCU's Canyon Professional Development services and applicable discounts.
