**A. Proposal to Approve the TRENTON EDUCATION DANCE INSTITUTE (TEDI) – Parker ES**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve the TRENTON EDUCATION DANCE INSTITUTE (TEDI)/The Children’s Home Society of New Jersey at Parker ES to provide a focused dance, education and youth development program that uses the discipline of dance to give students the opportunity to discover their innate dance abilities and develop life skills such as self-discipline, focus, teamwork, dependability, risk taking and persistence. Grade 5 students will have 60-minute weekly instruction in school; October 2018 through June 2019; Cost not to exceed \$5,000.00; GAAP Code 15-190-100-320-0000-00-27.

**B. Proposal to Approve the TRENTON EDUCATION DANCE INSTITUTE (TEDI) – P.J. HILL ES**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve the TRENTON EDUCATION DANCE INSTITUTE (TEDI)/The Children’s Home Society of New Jersey at P.J. Hill ES to provide a focused dance, education and youth development program that uses the discipline of dance to give students the opportunity to discover their innate dance abilities and develop life skills such as self-discipline, focus, teamwork, dependability, risk taking and persistence. Grade 5 students will have 60-minute weekly instruction in school; October 2018 through June 2019; Cost not to exceed \$5,000.00; GAAP Code 15-190-100-320-0000-00-32.

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve the TRENTON EDUCATION DANCE INSTITUTE (TEDI)/The Children’s Home Society of New Jersey at Gregory ES to provide a focused dance, education and youth development program that uses the discipline of dance to give students the opportunity to discover their innate dance abilities and develop life skills such as self-discipline, focus, teamwork, dependability, risk taking and persistence. Grade 5 students will have 60-minute weekly instruction in school; October 2018 through June 2019; Cost not to exceed \$5,000.00; GAAP Code 15-190-100-320-0000-00-21.

**D. Proposal to Approve the Power Mondays/Wonder Women Wednesdays 2018-19- Kilmer MS**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve the Power Mondays/Wonder Women Wednesdays 2018-19 at Kilmer MS. The program will implement self-awareness to support student growth and mindfulness to strengthen our students’ intrinsic values and exposure to community and civic leadership in grades 6-8. Male students will participate every first Monday and female students every fourth Wednesday in grade level workshops. Students will be expected to dress their best to promote workplace readiness skills; October 2018 through June 2019; No cost to the Board.

**E. Proposal to Approve Joyce Kilmer MS Health and Physical Education Outdoor Activities at Cadwalader Park**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve Joyce Kilmer MS Health and Physical Education Outdoor Activities at Cadwalader Park. The Joyce Kilmer PE department will offer the full spectrum of instruction by providing outdoor activities annually while school is in session across the street in Cadwalader Park. PE classes will be able to follow the curriculum for outdoor activities by using the playing fields and tennis courts during gym classes. A security guard will be assigned to monitor any non-instructional hazards; September 25, 2018 through June 21, 2019; No cost to the Board.

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**F. Proposal to Approve Minding Our Business (MOB) Spring 2019 Program at Joyce Kilmer MS**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve the Minding Our Business Spring 2019 Program at Joyce Kilmer MS. Minding Our Business will provide personal and vocational development for the students grades 6-8 at Kilmer MS. Students will participate in fifteen 90-minute training sessions. Rider University students will mentor a group of seven to fifteen students in team building, leadership, communications and entrepreneurship skills. An average of 40 Rider business students volunteer to be MOB mentors. Under the guidance of their mentors, each team develops, prepares and presents a business plan to judge by local business people. The student teams will execute their plans and manage their businesses at a community fair; February 3, 2019 through May 8, 2019; Cost not to exceed \$3,000.00; GAAP Code 15-130-100-101-0000-00-24.

**G. Proposal to Approve Boys and Girls Club of Mercer County – Mott ES**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve the Boys and Girls Club of Mercer County at Mott School. This program site would be home to a broad base of programs. These programs would be matched around Mott School activities to enable continuous after school care from dismissal to 6:15pm. The program will help students to set high goals for themselves and reach them. Students will develop career goals and then identify educational goals needed to attain that career path; September 25, 2018 through June 19, 2019; No cost to the Board.

**H. Proposal to Approve Mercer County Community College Athletic Department - TCHS**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to Approve the Mercer County Community College Athletic Department – TCHS. In keeping with the updated curriculum and providing students an opportunity to be involved in an organized team sport, swimming, this proposal is to request the use of Mercer County Community College pool for team practice. The long term goal s to continue to add athletes to strengthen the TCHS Swim Team while the main campus is under construction; November 7, 2018 through February 2, 2019; Cost not to exceed \$4,050.00; GAAP Code 11-402-100-330-0000-00-55.

Rivera is interested in further developing students Literacy Skills through the use of Google Classroom. Purchase of 9 Chrome Book Carts will lead to a need for development of a PLC for the staff piloting Google Classroom. Staff will engage in 10 hours of Professional Learning facilitated by a peer who is familiar with Google Classroom. Training will take place for 1.5 – 2 hours over the course of 5 weeks for a total of 10 hours; March 2018 through June 30, 2019; Cost not to exceed \$17,280.00.00; GAAP code 20-236-200-101-0009-19-82/ 20-236-200-610-0000-19-82.

**M. Proposal to Approve the Professional Learning Community Spanish Language Lessons for Staff at Rivera MS**
