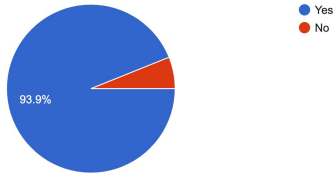

# TPS Virtual Classroom Visitation Checklist

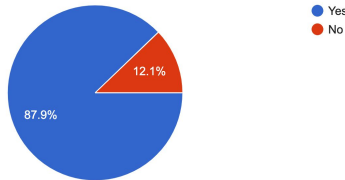
675 Classroom visits were completed across all school levels with the purpose of conducting a district-wide check of our instructional programs. To accomplish this goal the Curriculum Team put together a google form for school leaders to use during a 5 to 7 minute, non-evaluative classroom visit.

- 94% of the classroom visits found evidence of grade-level, standards-based instruction
- 88% of the classroom visits found evidence of a lesson outcome/objective or learning target
- 85% of the classroom visits found evidence of district-approved core instructional resources are used (i.e., Benchmark, Eureka, Studysync, Khan Academy, Delta Math, LaunchPad)

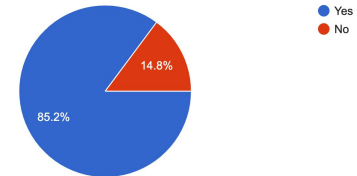
Is there evidence of grade-level, standards-based instruction?

# Reopening Committee Update

- Committee meeting scheduled for Friday, November 20.
  - Discussion points for the committee includes setting the stage to develop the plan for the safe reopening of schools. The Reopening plan includes a pivot into Phase Two Hybrid programming on January 4th. At this time we have already discussed pushing the transition date to January 19th at the earliest.
  - The second marking period ends on February 4th. This date will be taken into consideration when planning for high school programs with credit-bearing courses. The purpose of pushing back the start of Phase Two reentry is to allow time for all students and staff members to self-isolate after the holiday season. The Reopening Committee will prepare a staggered reopening plan prioritizing specialized populations and moving from there as we expand to provide more students with in-person instruction.

## Scheduling: November 30 to December 8

Many districts are adjusting schedules in response to the upcoming holidays and nationwide surge of covid-19 rates. Subsequently, the leadership team recommends limiting building access for the period of November 30 to December 8. Most of the instructional workforce teach remotely from their homes. Yet, we do have small numbers of teachers who instruct out of their classrooms for various reasons. To reduce traffic in our buildings after the Thanksgiving Holiday, we intend to close all schools to instructional staff. Doing so allows for social isolation after the holiday.

Please note that the instructional program will continue, and students will not experience disruption to their daily schedule. Adjustments will also be made for the central office to follow the modified schedule. Staff who work out of district buildings due to lack of internet access will be provided a hotspot to ensure connectivity from 11/30 to 12/7. All buildings to reopen on Tuesday, December 8th.
