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# School Wide Parental Involvement Policy

### PART I.

### Grace A. Dunn Middle School :

- 1. <u>Grace A. Dunn Middle School</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school wide parental involvement plan under section 1112 of the ESEA:

- 5. The <u>Grace A. Dunn Middle School</u> will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement policy in improving the quality of its Title I, Part A schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background).   - A survey will be sent to all parents who have not completed the survey at the parent meeting.
  - The Parental Involvement Policy Evaluation Committee will use the data from the survey to evaluate and possibly revise current policy.
- 1. The <u>Grace A Dunn Middle School</u> will seek to build the schools' and parent's capacity for strong parental involvement, in order to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, through the following activities specifically described below:
  - A. Each month our PTO meetings will include a specific focus designed to assist parents in becoming partners in their child's academic achievement. The focus will be determined in collaboration with the parents. The PTO will be combined with student celebrations and performance whenever possible.
  - C. The school will, provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training, and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:

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- Offering information to all parents through the district website and school newsletter.
- Offering parents e-mail addresses and phone extension for accessibility to school staff
- Providing all students will a student handbook.
- Hosting Parent Teacher conferences twice a year and an annual Back to School Night".
- D. The school will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:
  - Instructional materials provided for at home student use.
  - Open House night for parents and community members.
  - Parent Newsletter
  - District website.
  - Welcoming outside organizations to share information with parents.
- E. The school will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent- programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
  - Continue to coordinate and provide for students language needs via approved ESL and Bilingual programs and courses, which stands ready to assist any ESL families.
  - School Messenger will also be used to inform parents of meetings and up-coming events.
  - Face to face and telephone meetings with parents are encouraged.
