Technology

Introduction to Apple Edu Initiative: We are excited to announce a partnership with

Apple Edu! As we move forward toward a true integration of technology to leverage teaching and learning, the technology department has developed a plan to roll out a 1:1 iPad initiative for grades K-8 for the start of the 2023-24 school year. All students and teachers in grades K-8 will receive an iPad in conjunction with professional development to support teaching and learning, as well as support administrators with one-to-one leadership coaching and support throughout the school year.

All students in grades K-8 will be issued an iPad for educational use as part of our 1:1 program. Students will bring their device home and to school daily. The iPads will allow for easy use of digital materials,



student collaboration tools, and individualized instruction in all subject areas to enhance student learning. For more information on this initiative, please click here.

School News

Cadwalader Canines Care for Kids Program: Students at Cadwalader Elementary School have the opportunity to experience therapy with Sailor. Sailor is a certified therapy dog trained to enhance the work we are doing with trauma-informed care and healing-centered engagement. Principal Costanza has noticed a decrease in office referrals on Therapy Thursdays and an overall positive atmosphere at school with staff and students. The activities students take part in include cooperative games, reading, caring for Sailor, and taking care of his environment.

Food Smarts Kids Program: Students at PJ Hill Elementary School show off their fruit pizzas created as part of the Food Smarts Kids program. PJ Hill was featured in an <u>article by</u> <u>Rutgers NJ Agricultural Experiment Station Cooperative</u> <u>Extension of Mercer County</u>. This series is an interactive, learner-centered curriculum that focuses on helping children make healthy choices and to think about why they make the food choices they make.

Hedgepeth-Williams Intermediate School Overnight Trip: In partnership with Howard's Healthy Choices Organization, students from Hedgepeth-Williams Intermediate School attended an overnight trip to Princeton Blairstown Center. This 30-hour residential program provides students with inquiry-based, hands-on environmental education and social-emotional learning sessions that aim to help students engage more deeply with science and the scientific method, understand that









science is fun, and provide opportunities to explore future STEM careers.

Child Wellness Gala: TPS Partner, The Child Wellness Institute, awarded two \$2,500 scholarships to TCHS students at their 4th Anniversary Gala. Seniors Tymir Fennell and Taniya Ellerbe were the proud recipients of the Teen Resilience Scholarships. Fennell will be attending Norfolk State University, and Ellerbe will be attending Montclair State University. Both students were selected as their personal stories exemplified resilience and made a tremendous impact on the scholarship committee.

Drop Everything and Yoga: Gregory Elementary School launched a schoolwide mid-day yoga reset period. The school community engages in 10 minutes of yoga three days a week. Yoga instruction provides the students with another strategy and tool to use for self-regulation. Research has shown that yoga and mindfulness improve both physical and mental health in school-age children. The 10-minute yoga reset helps to provide students and staff with strategies to use for self-regulation.

Science Circus: McKnight's K-3 students recently had the opportunity to learn about scientific concepts during their assembly with the Liberty Science Center. During the event, students were introduced to the basics of electricity, air, and the three states of matter.

Intermediate School Basketball League: the district collaborated with the TCHS Alumni Basketball Association to host a grade 4-6 intermediate school basketball league. Parents and community members came out every Saturday in April and May to cheer on their school during the basketball games. Cheerleaders and dance teams from grades 4-6 joined and performed at halftime.

Mobile health vans will be on-site to offer free school-mandated immunizations, eye exams, dental, and other health screenings. Teaching & Learning

ESL/Bilingual

Professional Development: New teachers in the district attended a Novice Teacher Professional Development session focusing on best instructional practices for our Multilingual Learners (MLs). The focus of the session was placed on instructional strategies for MLs to meet individual language needs. Our session modeled a "Make-and-Take" structure, where teachers could take away two to three instructional practices that could easily be implemented into their classrooms to support and foster interaction among students to strengthen speaking and listening skills.

Biliteracy and Bilingualism: On June 15, TPS will celebrate 102 students receiving the New Jersey State Seal of Biliteracy Award. Graduating seniors voluntarily take the test

funded by TPS. The languages represented this year are Spanish, French, Haitian Creole, and Urdu. The State of New Jersey established the State Seal of Biliteracy in 2016 to recognize high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more foreign languages in addition to English.

The purpose of this award is to encourage students to study languages; to certify attainment of biliteracy; to provide employers with a method of identifying people with language and biliteracy





skills; to provide universities with a method to recognize and award academic credit to applicants seeking admission; to prepare students with 21st-century skills; to recognize and promote foreign language instruction in public schools; and to strengthen intergroup relationships, affirm the value of diversity, and honor the multiple cultures and languages of a community. To date, TPS has awarded 307 NJ State Seal of Biliteracy Awards.

Social Studies

The Social Studies department launched a series of professional development on **Inquiry Design Model (IDM)**. **IDM** provides an integral opportunity to empower students through the integration of interdisciplinary instructional strategies and practices within the Social Studies context.

Inquiry provides students with the opportunity to learn how to make informed and reasoned decisions for the public good as citizens of a culturally diverse, democratic society and in the world.



Mathematics

The elementary math department will adopt two new math programs for the 2023-24 school year, <u>Bridges in Mathematics</u> for our kindergarten students and <u>enVision Math</u> for grades 1-6.

- **Kindergarten Bridges in Mathematics** is a comprehensive curriculum that equips teachers to fully address state standards in a rigorous, engaging, and accessible manner. Students gain a deep understanding of concepts, proficiency with key skills, and the ability to solve complex problems.
- **K-8 enVision Math** focuses on student understanding with Problem-Based Learning (PBL), where students must think critically about a real-world math problem, evaluate options, collaborate, and present solutions. Students in grades 6-8 learned using enVision Math this past school year.
- **Grades 9-12:** Our high school students began using <u>Reveal's Algebra</u> or <u>Geometry</u> (by McGraw-Hill) for the first time this school year.

Career Readiness

Within the Career Readiness Department, we continued to have students earn college credits in pre-med and pre-nursing in our Allied Health program. This year, high school students were able to participate in the carpenters' union and others have continued to earn industry certifications in various programs.

For the 2023-24 school year, students will be able to take part in engineering and manufacturing programs. The district will be adding a certification course to become a Black Seal Operator. Students will have the opportunity to learn about Project Lead the Way, which is nationally recognized by colleges and employers. Students at both TCHS and DTHS will have the opportunity to take aviation courses to become pilots, air traffic controllers, and airplane technicians.

Public Schools

English & World Language Departments

In the K-8 ELA classrooms, we have successfully implemented a pilot of a new core resource in reading and writing. Schoolwide focuses on best literacy practices with a focus on the "I Do (Instruct), We Do (Model), You Do (Independent Work)" model of instruction. It helps foster student identities as readers and writers and celebrates collaboration through highly engaging lessons and activities. In Grades 9-12 ELA, AP, and NJSLA testing was completed. Teachers focused on student engagement and <u>academic discourse</u> throughout the year.
