Students in grades K - 6, will learn the importance of what constitutes bullying behavior and how to prevent it on their part. - ❖ Mentor teacher does not serve as their mentee's direct supervisor nor conduct evaluations of teachers.
- ❖ Mentor trainings occur year round to include, at a minimum, training on the school district's teaching evaluation rubric and practice instrument, the New Jersey Professional Standards for Teachers, the New Jersey Student Learning Standards, classroom observation skills, facilitating adult learning and leading reflective conversations about teaching practice.
- ❖ Mentoring time is logged and mentor payments are handled through the district office.
- ❖ Novice teacher is required to complete the TPS Payroll Deduction Form which provides the novice teacher options on how much is to be taken out per pay period. This form ensures the full amount is deducted then paid to the mentor upon completion of the mentor requirements.
- ❖ Ongoing training will take place throughout the course of the school year for novice and mentor teachers pursuant to NJAC 6A:9-8.3 in accordance with the local mentoring plan NJAC 6A:9-8.4.
- ❖ The Professional Development Committee will provide ongoing assessment and



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reflection in order to meet the needs of the alternate route novice teachers (CE) and the traditional route novice teachers (CEAS).

The NJ Quality Single Accountability Continuum (QSAC) Performance Review for Personnel requires the district mentoring plan describe how mentors are trained and describe the process by which the administrative office oversees mentor payments (N.J.A.C. 6A:9C-5)

**II. Resolution to Approve the Participation of the Trenton School District with Foreign Language Educators of NJ (FLENJ) in the Pathway to Biliteracy Pilot**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools approves the Resolution for the Participation of the Trenton School District with Foreign Language Educators of NJ (FLENJ) in the Pathway to Biliteracy Pilot. The need to assess and recognize bilingual eighth grade students early on in their educational journey who have attained a high level of proficiency in all language domains in one or more foreign languages in addition to English. We understand that the Trenton School District is participating in establishing the criteria and providing feedback to the Pathway to Biliteracy committee based on students' achievements. The Trenton Board of Education approves the District Proposal to participate in the Pilot of Pathway to Biliteracy at no cost to the board.
