PERFORMANCE OF EXCELLENCE

Students Jameerah Hill and Tamia Jones from Rivera Learning Center performed an original African dance, directed and choreographed by Paraprofessional Ms. Solomon. Ms. Montaña read a poem written by student Whitney Foxworth, in honor of Martin Luther King, Jr. Mr. Durán stated that all the students from Rivera were assisted for tonight's performance by Music Teacher Ms. Fisher and School Psychologists Mr. Ingram and Ms. Narkus. Additionally, artwork by Franklin School students was displayed in the auditorium. The students created their works of art under the direction of Art Teacher Mr. Wiley. Franklin Music Teacher Mr. Burd led his students in singing "*I'm So Glad to be Here*" and "*This Little Light of Mine.*"

BOARD COMMENTS ON PERFORMANCE

Ms. Montaña stated that all the performers were terrific, and President Sanders thanked all the parents who came out to support their students. Mr. Truehart felt the students did an excellent job.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

President Sanders reminded everyone of the rules governing public comment, most importantly respecting the right of privacy of students and staff. Board Attorney Carl Tanksley, Jr. added that if any individual feels he/she has been defamed publicly, said individual has the right to take legal action. He advised that the rules governing public comment are designed to reduce the amount of litigation.

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Ms. Betty Glenn, President of the Trenton Paraprofessionals Association (TPA), thanked the Superintendent and the Board Members who attended the Parent Forum on March 9. She also expressed concern about how some of her unit members were treated by certain staff.

Ms. Naomi Johnson-Lafleur, President of the Trenton Education Association (TEA), said that the student performances this evening are illustrative of the District's successes. She called the Board's attention to Curriculum Item E, stating that TEA has been conversing with leadership team regarding the required 150 minutes of Physical Education for elementary students. She stated that the practice in New Jersey, including every school district in Mercer County, has been that certified Physical Education teachers teach students Health and Physical Education. She felt that approval of this agenda item would constitute a change in the terms and conditions of employment, which TEA contends must be negotiated. She asked that Curriculum Item E be pulled, and that the schedule be looked at to determine how the 150 minutes can be made up.

Ms. Johnson-Lafleur also called the Board's attention to Finance Item X. She felt that any discussions on privatizing the alternative middle school must be held in collaboration with all stakeholders. She stated for the record that the alternative middle school program was the brainchild of the former fiscal monitor assigned to Trenton, who created the program, established it, staffed it and monitored it. Ms. Johnson-Lafleur said the fiscal monitor, along with his hand-picked Special Ed directors, designed the alternative middle school program at Rivera Learning Community (RLC) without input from, or collaboration with, Trenton's education community. She said the main objective was to save dollars by bringing students back in District, at the expense of providing services to this student population. Ms. Johnson-Lafleur felt that any contention that the RLC program is not working must be directed at the former fiscal monitor. She stated that privatization has not worked in the District and felt that it will not work with the alternative middle school either.

Ms. Nola Occhipinti, School Psychologist at Hedgepeth Williams School, spoke on behalf of the staff at the school. She stated they are concerned about the negative effects to students that a possible change in administration at the school would have. She said staff wishes the current Principal be kept in place to continue the progress that has been made under his leadership.

Ms. Vivian Byrd, Paraprofessional at Hedgepeth Williams, also spoke in support of the Principal at the school. A petition signed by staff was provided to the Board.

Mr. William Mackson spoke about his program Hip Hop Edutainment, which encourages students to read more through hip hop, rap and rhyme.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REMARKS

Mr. Durán thanked all those involved in the March 9 Parent Summit, stating that it was an amazing event. He reported that the TCHS Boys Winter Track Team are Group IV

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Champions, Mercer County Champions and State Runner-up. He also added that the TCHS Boys Basketball Team was Runner-up to the State Championship in Group IV. Mr. Durán said it is important to publicize all successes in the District, both academic and athletic. Also, wrestler Maaziah Bethea was fifth place in the State.

The Superintendent announced that the District's new website will be launched at the end of March, and more good news items will be featured through that venue. He stated that the website will be available in many languages, it will be more user-friendly, and it will allow for a page for every school and an optional page for every teacher.

The Superintendent thanked all the committees working on the reconfiguration. He stated that the Curriculum Committee will be giving a status report this evening. A presentation will also be given on the Gifted & Talented program. There is further information on the website for those interested in participating on the Gifted & Talented Educational Services (GATES) planning team.

Mr. Durán stated that a committee will be established to work towards addressing the needs of the alternative middle school students. He stated that the District must do more in this area, and that a lot of students can be served in District. He praised the work of the teachers and staff at RLC.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Ms. Montañó thanked everyone who was involved in organizing the Parent Forum, stating that all aspects of the event were wonderful and empowering. She expressed disappointment that more families were not in attendance.

Ms. Montañó expressed her appreciation to Mr. Durán for focusing on Gifted & Talented. Lastly, she thanked all the committee and community members who testified at the Schools Development Authority (SDA) meeting regarding the high school project. She stated she is glad that everyone is partnering in this endeavor, and she asked the Board President to set up a Facilities Advisory Board (FAB) meeting in the near future.

Ms. Taylor-Hayes acknowledged TEA, TPA, the parents committee, Early Childhood and NJEA for all their efforts in organizing the Parent Forum. She stated the day provided food for the body and soul, and everything was very well done.

Ms. Millington also felt that the Parent Forum was amazing and inspiring. She stated it was a wonderful day and very well organized. She also felt that more needs to be done to increase parental participation. She joined Ms. Montañó in thanking everyone who attended the SDA meeting and advocated for Trenton. Lastly, Ms. Millington expressed her gratitude that Finance Item X has been pulled this evening, stating that the issue of the alternative school does indeed need more conversation. She felt sure that the school can be a success if everyone works together.

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Mr. Truehart felt that there has been food for the mind, along with understanding and awareness at tonight's meeting, as evidenced by the change in the agenda and comments made. He stated this is for the betterment of the District. He also observed words of encouragement from the students who performed this evening, as well as from the community members who have been involved in the schools and the District. He read the District's Mission Statement:

*All Students Will Graduate With A Vision For Their Futures,
Motivated To Learn Continually
And Prepared To Succeed In Their Choice of College Or Career*

Mr. Truehart recalled the earlier public comments by Mr. Mackson, stating that Hip Hop Catz is a wonderful program, and he looked forward to hearing more about the program and the students participating.

Mr. Truehart felt it very important that the District take a Stand Against Racism, and he asked that the Board pass a resolution to partner with organizations, such as the YMCA, in the Stand Against Racism in April. He hoped that a local event could be held at the District, and he described the annual event that is held across the country.

President Sanders thanked the Franklin and Rivera students and parents who participated in the Performance of Excellence. He also thanked an earlier public speaker for her preparedness and professionalism in representing staff members at Hedgepeth Williams.

President Sanders wished to celebrate student accomplishments in both academics and athletics, stating that Trenton has extraordinary scholar athletes. He also said that the Superintendent and the entire Board sees those who have made contributions to build pride in the community.

Lastly, President Sanders asked the public to be cognizant, during tonight's presentations, of the work the District is currently doing and what is planned for the future to fulfill the Board's objectives. He said that both are important to keep in mind. He also thanked those who have been involved in the high school facilities project, and he advised that a meeting of the FAB will be convened in the very near future. He expressed appreciation for the public show of unity on this issue.

PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD

Ms. Lucy Feria, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction, Assessment and Professional Development, introduced the update by the Curriculum Reconfiguration Committee focusing on the middle school framework for 2013-2014 (handout attached). Board questions and comments were in the following areas:

- Model middle school visits
- Working within the final budgets for middle schools when proposing changes

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- Investment in technology needed for middle school students
- Appreciation for timelines
- Benefits to current year's students from the committee's research
- Schedule of the remainder of all committees' presentations
- Challenging work ahead for all leadership

Mr. Norberto Diaz, Supervisor for Performing Arts and Gifted & Talented, presented on the work of the GATES planning team (handout attached). Board questions and comments were in the areas of:

- Budgeting for resources needed for the program
- Breakdown by grade level of students who scored Advanced Proficient on NJASK
- Continuing the program through the high school years
- Staffing the program
- Federal funds for Gifted & Talented programs
- History of Gifted & Talented program in Trenton
- Financially sustaining the program
- Meeting the needs of students who are border line to the program to increase participation
- Looking past standardized tests for determining qualified students
- Many different facets of gifts and talents, resulting in an increase in the percentage of students who qualify

Ms. Mary Ann Friedman, Field Service Representative from the New Jersey School Boards Association (NJSBA), presented the results of the 2011-2012 Board Self Evaluation (BSE). The BSE is a tool to illustrate Board strengths and weaknesses. It should be completed on a yearly basis to ensure Board accountability to the community and to the Board itself. Ms. Friedman went over the timelines for submission of the BSE and the Superintendent's Evaluation, and the process for logging onto the NJSBA website to complete the evaluations. Per NJ Statute, the Superintendent's Evaluation process must be completed in its entirety no later than April 30 of each year.

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The Superintendent requested that Curriculum Item J be pulled. The Board President stated that information has come to Administration's attention, which compels this action be taken. He asked for a motion to pull this item.

Motion was made by Ms. Millington and seconded by Mr. Truehart to pull Curriculum Item J. The motion was **approved** by all Board Members present. Curriculum Item J is **pulled**.

Ms. Montaña called the Board's attention to Curriculum Item D, stating that she was under the impression the Board had already approved this item. The Superintendent answered they did approve it, but this item is to clarify the exact dollar amount.

Ms. Montaña asked about Finance Item V, wishing to know if all students will have iPads. Mr. Durán stated that we are working towards that, but as of now the first and primary focus is accessibility at the schools. He said that some schools are not currently able to have WiFi at the level needed. The teachers are training on the technology now and will be using it in the near future. Dr. Wesley Boykin, Executive Director for Systems, Data Management and Accountability, added that as a result of this training, teachers will be able to use the iPads instructionally. Various schools have purchased iPads with their funds, but intensive professional development is needed on use of the device in the classroom setting. Not every teacher has an iPad, but many do.

Ms. Tatum called the Board's attention to Curriculum Item F. She asked for further information. The Superintendent stated there is a document in the Attachments section of the paperless agenda. Due to a clerical error, Attachment 1F was not indicated as such under the Superintendent's Recommendations section.

Ms. Tatum asked about Human Resources Item G, wondering if this item should be pulled due to other agenda items pulled earlier during the meeting. The Superintendent stated that HR Item G does not correlate to the Finance Item pulled. Finance Item X is relative to Cadwalader School, not Rivera School.

Ms. Taylor-Hayes asked for clarity on Curriculum Item E. Ms. Feria stated that she has asked the Athletic Director to investigate possibilities for physical education, one resolution being to ensure that PE teachers have a full roster. Another resolution was to look at Grades K-2 in reference to providing teachers with lesson plans. State regulations do allow for K-2 teachers to provide PE instruction.

a. Proposal for Revising the Health and Physical Education Curriculum for K-12

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Proposal for **Revising the Health and Physical Education Curriculum for K-12** for the period April 8, 2013 through June 30, 2013 at a cost not to exceed **\$17,280.00**. Four lead teachers and 16 Health and Physical Education teachers will revise the curriculum guides to ensure they are aligned to the new Common Core State Standards, Model Curriculum.
