SUPERINTENDENT’S REMARKS

Acting Superintendent Llano discussed the Phase II Hybrid Reopening Schedule, Health Updates, Preschool Updates, Professional Development, Donations and Partnerships, Climate Change Forum for Teachers, Dual Credit and Certification Opportunities for Students and Curriculum Writing. There were no Board questions or comments.

COMMENTS BY BOARD COMMITTEE CHAIRS

Ms. Weakliem provided a Facilities update and said the Committee recently toured the schools, which are in an impeccable state regarding Covid readiness. She thanked everyone involved in this effort.

Ms. Daniels-Lane reported on the Operations Committee meeting, where members reviewed the usual monthly financial documents, donations, the resolution to join CJ Pride, additional grant funding and an update to the Five-Year Preschool Program. The Committee also reviewed the 2021-2022 Budget, which will be presented during tonight's meeting.

Reporting on the Curriculum Committee, Ms. Daniels-Lane said the Committee reviewed the proposals on tonight's agenda. She stated the Committee was happy to see increased opportunities for our students through various programs including dual certification, early college, summer programs and industry partnerships.

STUDENT PERFORMANCE

Teacher Mr. Raman Nadadhur introduced his TCHS Students taking Medical Math through the Rutgers Dual Credit Program. The Students discussed their experiences with the course.

TCHS Visual and Performing Arts, under the direction of their Teacher Ms. Felicia Brown, performed *Twisted Tales of Poe* for the Board and the public. Board Members expressed appreciation for both performances.

PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD

Acting Superintendent Llano and Ms. Howard presented on the 2021-2022 Budget (handout attached). Board questions and comments were as follows:

Mr. Llano also presented on the Five Year Strategic Plan (handout attached). Mr. Jesse Adams, Field Representative from New Jersey School Boards Association, worked with Administration on the Strategic Plan; and he expressed appreciation for everyone's input into the final product. Mr. Adams stated there were many stakeholders who participated in the process. Board questions and comments on the presentation were as follows:

- Appreciation for the involvement of all stakeholders in developing the Strategic Plan
- Looking forward to future under the Plan

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Ms. Marlana Ventura, Kindergarten Teacher and Second Vice President of TEA, felt the District needs to have more Substitute Teachers prior to resuming in-person instruction since everyone's immune systems have been weakened during lockdown and other viruses may sicken numerous staff and students. Ms. Ventura also felt more thought needs to be given to the specifics of a hybrid model. She questioned the decision to reinstate in-person learning so late in the school year and felt that not much learning will take place for her

young students due to time spent getting them back on routine and teaching them how to behave in the building during the time of Covid.

Mr. John Forte, Teacher at TCHS, said there is much anxiety on the part of staff and students on returning to in-person instruction. He discussed the concerns of Black and Brown parents regarding the return to school. He stated that inequities such as wealth gaps and racist police violence need to be resolved through State intervention, not free market solutions. Lastly, Mr. Forte read some of the concerns expressed by his students.

Ms. Carol Feldman, Founder and Executive Director of Shine and Inspire, spoke about her organization's role in serving Trenton students and families. She discussed the many tangible supplies that are provided to families in need.

Ms. Lanise Hill, World Language Teacher at Kilmer, said that fully remote students will not be instructed by a live teacher due to liability issues and teachers not being trained to conduct simultaneous classes, both live and remote. She believes they will receive asynchronous instruction with information provided by the teacher, based on the District documentation available. She asked if parents will be provided transparency and a revised survey, and she also expressed concern about attendance rates.

Ms. Michelle Marrazzo discussed concerns of Parker School staff with the school's climate and culture. She stated that administration is creating a hostile work environment. Concerns include interruptions to instructional time, disrespect towards staff members, conducting classroom walkthroughs and meetings during instructional time and conflicting directives from administration. Ms. Marrazzo said that TEA offers to meet have been declined by administration. She said the expressed concerns have been unaddressed for too long.

Ms. Nicole Backlund, Art Teacher, said there are unanswered questions needing to be addressed prior to school buildings re-opening:

- Supervision for in-person students of a teacher with a 504 working from home
- Need for enough substitute teachers to be secured
- Method for delivery of lessons virtually and in-person simultaneously
- Students and staff safely moving in hallways
- Bathroom cleanliness
- Mask-less breakfast in classrooms takes away instructional time
- Daily sign-in and temperature taking
- Meeting bell-to-bell time with numerous interruptions
- Protocol for teachers who have been diagnosed with Covid-19
- Disabled students exhibiting physical behaviors which can spread the virus
- Students refusing to wear masks or wearing them improperly

Ms. Sharon Hamm-Graves, Technology Teacher, also discussed concerns at Parker School including harassment and intimidation of staff members. She said teachers do not

Speak out due to fear of retaliation. Lastly, she stated that if the concerns are not resolved, staff members are ready to start a petition for the removal of administration at the school.

Ms. Susan Browdy, Kindergarten Teacher, echoed the concerns of Ms. Ventura. She said she misses her students and the ability to work with them and celebrate birthdays, holidays, etc. with them. She also expressed concern about procedures for students eating in the classroom.

Mr. Darren Freedom Green, Community, expressed appreciation for all those involved in making the fall sports season possible. He said that having a District staff member as a county commissioner will be advantageous to the schools. Lastly, he expressed appreciation for student achievement and excellence.

Dr. John Guindon, Teacher at Rivera, said that people making decisions on re-opening are not on the front lines. He urged them to listen to people who are on the front lines when they raise questions. He expressed concern about rising numbers of Covid infections and observed that the Governor has paused plans for further re-opening the State. Dr. Guindon asked if a plan has been put in place to address teacher and staff absences. He also stated there is a new variant of Covid-19 that may be impervious to the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines. He asked what the plan is for students who refuse to abide by required safety rules in the schools. He felt that schools should not re-open until at least September or until all the concerns are addressed. Lastly, he stated that if it is safe enough to return to school, Board meetings should be held in person.

Ms. Sandy Jimenez, Teacher, said that if schools reopen in a hybrid model on May 3, students will only be in person for a total of 15 days until the end of the school year. She said this will result in students only seeing their teacher for two days per week rather than the current three days per week. Ms. Jimenez felt that returning to in-person instruction at this time will result in less learning for students, particularly the youngest ones. She also stated that no students have been vaccinated but they can still carry the virus to their families, and she asked if having 15 days of instruction is worth the risk of re-opening at this time. She said New Jersey had its largest single day total of new cases in two months on March 20, and she expressed concern about the current statistics.

Ms. Janice Williams, TEA Grievance Chair, expressed concern about the attendance record of a Board Member. She stated that said Board Member should not be allowed to vote on important items such as the selection of a permanent Superintendent, and she said she will encourage a petition for the recall of this member. She also stated that community partners who wish to update the Board on their activities should contact the Board Secretary to be placed on the agenda as a presentation, rather than sign up for Public Participation. Ms. Williams felt that the Early Childhood Program should not have been moved out of the District, and she called the Board's attention to the amount of funds being shifted to private providers. She felt that costs can be contained by providing the service in District. She also felt that having a Gifted & Talented Program in District will stem the loss of students to Charter Schools. Lastly, she said that decisions regarding spending of

Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) grant funding must be made by a cohort inclusive of all stakeholders.

Ms. Talithea Duncan, TEA President, expressed concern about administration at the Trenton Restorative Academy (TRA). She said that a hostile work environment has been created due to the following acts of administration:

- Violating duty free prep and lunch time
- Making anti-union statements
- Making members fearful to contact their union reps
- Directing members to give directives to their colleagues in the same bargaining unit
- Conducting extended walk-throughs in the classrooms of members who have raised contractual violations, resulting in write-ups given to members who previously received no complaints prior to reporting contractual violations

Ms. Duncan also said there are currently 72 students and about 25-30 TEA members at TRA, there have been a total of nine transfers and three resignations at the school and the school is on its third Vice Principal. She stated that TEA has discussed their issues with administration at TRA and nothing has changed. She asked the Board to direct the Superintendent to conduct a thorough investigation at TRA.

President Daniels-Lane thanked everyone for their participation; and she advised the public that once school re-opens, the Board will go back to in-person meetings.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Ms. Marrero-Lopez felt that Students of the Month should be recognized at Board meetings. President Daniels-Lane agreed.

Ms. Brossoie asked that someone investigate the climate and culture situations raised in the Public Participation portion of the meeting.
