SUPERINTENDENT’S REMARKS

Acting Superintendent Llano asked Assistant Superintendents Ms. Hope Grant and Dr. Channing Conway to approach the podium to announce the recipients of the Governor’s Educators of the Year awards. President Daniels-Lane congratulated all the awardees on behalf of the Board.

COMMENTS BY BOARD COMMITTEE CHAIRS

Mr. Bouie reported on the Operations Committee meeting, where the monthly financial reports were reviewed. He stated that the District received a three-year technology grant in the amount of \$700,000.00 by an anonymous donor. These funds will be used to audit and improve the District’s technology infrastructure. There is also a Verizon grant for the four middle schools to have a technology coach and receive iPads. Lastly, Mr. Bouie thanked the generous donors on tonight’s Finance Recommendations.

On behalf of the FACE Committee, Mr. Truehart reminded everyone of the weekly broadcasts on WIMG 1300 AM and Verizon Channel 28. Much valuable information on District happenings is shared during these broadcasts, such as the focus areas of summer enrichment programs, details on District reopening plans, the benefits of various instructional programs for our students and services for families in need. Additionally, Covid testing is held every Friday at the Administration building from 12:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m.; and vaccinations will be available for students 12-18 years of age. Mr. Truehart advised there will be a Juneteenth celebration in June. Lastly, he stated that the Policy Committee approved over 89 combined policy and regulation revisions over the last year. He thanked all those involved in this endeavor.

President Daniels-Lane advised that the Curriculum Committee discussed proposals on tonight’s Curriculum Recommendations, including those for extended translator services, amendments to the learning loss program, coding for students and qvarious partnerships. In the area of special needs, the committee discussed expanding the self-contained

program, inclusion, out of class replacement, compensatory services, the Extended School Year program, adding a Child Study Team, and the closing of two Corrective Action Plans (CAP) with one CAP still open.

PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD

Mr. Norberto Diaz, Supervisor of Visual and Performing Arts, introduced Ms. Jacqui Ivey and Ms. Mabel Watson from Arts for Any Given Child. Ms. Ivey and Ms. Watson presented on the “Art of Giving” Campaign (handout attached). Board questions and comments were in the following areas:

- Appreciation for the program
- District contribution of supplies

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

President Daniels-Lane reviewed the procedures outlined in Bylaw 0167 - Public Participation in Board Meetings.

Ms. Marlena Ventura, Teacher, expressed concern with the decision of the judge in the injunction case against Trenton Education Association (TEA). She stated there was no work stoppage because teachers logged in and students received instruction. She felt that docking of teachers’ pay was vindictive and that teachers are not respected. She also expressed concern with the requirements of the assessment calendar for Kindergarten and felt it is unfair to students. Lastly, she asked Administration to listen to the teachers.

Ms. Michelle Marrazzo, Teacher, stated that the Board was not properly following the mask mandate given in the instructions for return to in-person Board meetings. She again expressed concern with water in the basement at Wilson School. She also felt the scoring metric on the PD evaluation for hybrid instruction was too lenient. Ms. Marrazzo said there is no consistency across schools for delivering hybrid instruction, and she said there should be one cohesive plan for the District.

TEA President Ms. Talithea Duncan felt there is complacency among the Board regarding concerns brought to their attention, and she stated this is disrespectful to all stakeholders. She said that TEA does not enjoy reporting concerns each month, and the Board should practice due diligence in responding to them. She also felt that deceptive practices are used to limit public participation and that responses given to concerns are inadequate and untrue.

TEA Grievance Chair Ms. Janice Williams expressed concern with the Board Members appointed by the Mayor. She felt the Board Members do not respect the wishes of the community. She also stated that the Mayor did not respond to the concerns of TEA regarding the Superintendent Search, particularly the lack of transparency to the community. She said this led to a negative starting point for the new Superintendent. Ms. Williams stated that the demographics of the Board do not reflect the Trenton community.

She also felt that the District was not ready to reopen safely. Lastly, she spoke of the value of TEA's partnership with the District; and she asked that the new Superintendent be given the opportunity to choose his own cabinet members.

Ms. Sandy Jimenez, Teacher, echoed Ms. Marrazzo's concerns with the lack of consistency in opening plans. She mentioned the areas of overflow rooms, lack of substitute teachers and temperature checking routines.

Dr. John Guindon, Teacher, felt that responses to public concerns are not honest. He said staff cohesiveness affects student achievement. He also expressed concern about how the Superintendent Search was conducted, and he asked for everyone to work together.

Ms. Nicole Backlund, Teacher, felt that various conditions in the District are not benefiting students. She also expressed concern with the Superintendent Search, and she asked that the Board and Administration place the interests of students foremost in their decision-making process.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Vice President McKnight congratulated the winners of the Governor's awards. She thanked former Board Members Ms. Sadé Williams and Ms. Nicole Brossoie for their service on the Board. She recalled Ms. Ventura's concern regarding assessments for Kindergarten students, and she asked the Superintendent for more information on the subject.

Mr. Truehart observed there are many facilities challenges in the District, and he said that staff members are doing everything possible to ensure safety in the buildings. He felt this shows willingness to work collaboratively with all stakeholders. Mr. Truehart also discussed safety procedures at the Administration Building and at TCHS. He said the same procedures should be followed in every building. Lastly, Mr. Truehart maintained that the Board and Administration cares very much about the safety of students and staff.

President Daniels-Lane recalled the concern regarding water on the floor at Wilson School, and she asked Facilities Administrator Mr. Dwayne Mosley to address that. Mr. Mosley stated that the area has a low water table, and this is the cause of the flooding in the basement. He stated that a sump pump was installed, and this works to address the water accumulation. Mr. Mosley said he has contacted the City, and an engineer has assessed the problem. He discussed the lengthy and expensive process for a permanent fix to the problem. He also stated that air quality assessments have been done, and the results will be shared with all staff when they are received. Ms. McKnight felt the repair should be placed on the Long Range Facilities Plan. Ms. Weakliem felt that the immediate concern of musty smells in the classrooms should be addressed. Mr. Truehart wished to ensure safety for staff and students in the school. A concentrated discussion ensued regarding facilities in general (some poor audio quality from the Board dais). In closing, Mr. Mosely

asked Wilson School staff members to stop entering the basement for their own safety. President Daniels-Lane agreed.

There is a need to assist *Newcomer Immigrant English Language Learners (ELLs) to breach the learning gap that has occurred during virtual instruction and support students to exit the Bilingual Program. In order for these students to receive instructional support to prepare them to perform at high levels across all content areas, on benchmark tests, as well as on state standardized assessments, extended learning opportunities must be offered during the summer months. The proposed Learning Loss Intervention Program for ELLs will be provided in conjunction with district school-based summer enrichment and intervention programs. This Learning Loss Intervention program will provide NC Immigrant ELLs with an opportunity to regain any learning loss experienced during virtual instruction. Our goals are to increase English proficiency and math skills of ELLs and help students achieve higher academic gains as evidenced by NJ standardized assessments and ACCESS 2.0. In addition, this program will expose students to local resources as a way to integrate them into the community. This proposal requests approval to carry out the following allowable
