**A. Proposal to Approve TYPING.COM for K-5 Students.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve TYPING.COM for K-5 Students. Typing.com is a typing platform that gives students quick and easy choices, for those who need to learn typing skills quickly. Typing.com, as the name suggests, is an online platform that gives lessons and activities in typing skills. July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$21,048.00; GAAP code 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81.

**B. Proposal to Approve Re-Districting Plan Community Input and Stakeholder Meetings.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve Re-Districting Plan Community Input and Stakeholder Meetings. We will hold meetings based on the grade spans of the plan: K-3, 4-6 and 7-8. During the meetings participants will be allowed to view the map of the city with the catchment areas for that grade span on them. One goal of these sessions will be to capture supports that will be needed to make the plans effective. July 1, 2021 and August 31, 2021. No cost to the Board.

**C. Proposal to Approve Morning & After School Supervision 2021-22 SY - Rivera Community School.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Morning & After School Supervision 2021-22 SY - Rivera Community School. Staff will provide supervision to students who arrive at school for participation in the Morning Breakfast Program and outside supervision prior to 8:00 am Staff to provide Bus Supervision afterschool after 2:30 pm. September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$16,560.00; GAAP code: 15-421-200-110-0009-00-81.

**D. Proposal to Approve the Scheduling Rivera Community Middle School, SY' 2021-2022.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Scheduling Rivera Community Middle School, SY' 2021-2022. In an effort to further brand our schools and provide choice to students within their electives, Rivera Community Middle School will establish Accelerated, Resource and integrated classes within the scope of the TBOE Course offering catalogue for Middle Schools that allows students choice. This will require time spent in the summer adjusting individual student schedules. July 15, 2021 through August 31, 2021. Cost not to exceed \$5,184.00; GAAP code: 15-130-100-101-0009-00-15.

**E. Proposal to Approve the RCMS Technology Preparation Program.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the RCMS Technology Preparation Program. As a result of the school closures and reliance upon Remote Learning due to COVID-19 as well as the addition of the VILS program to Rivera, it is imperative that technology that was distributed be cleaned up, repaired, and programmed for the 2021-2022 school year. In order to ensure we are in the best possible position for instruction for our VILS program in the Fall we will need to prepare our technology. August 9, 2021 through August 31, 2021. Cost not to exceed \$1440.00; GAAP code: 20-236-200-101-0009-20-82.

**F. Proposal to Approve the RCMS Technology Student Support and Preparation Program.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the RCMS Technology Student Support and Preparation Program. In order to develop a successful technology team to help meet our #3 ASP goal and to assist in the success of the VILS program the Rivera VILS technology coordinator will work with our Rivera school based team over the summer. As a result, this team will then be able to assist teachers and students in the implementation of VILS and the use of the Innovation Lab. July 6, 2021 through August 13, 2021. Cost not to exceed \$2,520.00; GAAP code: 20-236-100-101-0009-20-82.

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**G. Proposal to Approve the Amplify Science PD-Rivera Community Middle School 21-22 SY.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the Amplify Science PD-Rivera Community Middle School 21-22 SY. Amplify Science blends hands-on investigations, literacy-rich activities, and interactive digital tools to empower students to think, read, write, and argue like real scientists and engineers. Each unit of Amplify Science engages students in a relevant, real-world problem where they investigate scientific phenomena, engage in collaboration and discussion, and develop models or explanations in order to arrive at solutions. Amplify Science includes hands-on activities, print materials, and powerful digital tools to support online and offline teaching and learning. Highly adaptable and user-friendly, the program gives schools and individual teachers flexibility based on their technology resources and preferences. In each unit, students take on the role of a scientist or engineer to investigate a real-world problem. These problems provide relevant contexts through which students investigate phenomena. Teachers will receive training in how to ensure Next Gen Science Standards and Literacy are infused in their daily Science Instruction. September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$2,500; GAAP code: 15-190-100-320-0000-00-15.

**H. Proposal to Approve AM & PM Supervision 2021-22 SY - Parker School.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the AM & PM Supervision 2021-22 SY - Parker School. Staff members will provide supervision during morning arrival and dismissal to ensure a safe environment for students. Staff will assist, the Lead Person in the oversight of the federally funded breakfast program and activities that lead up to the start of the instructional time. Also, staff members will supervise late-pick up students in the designated area of the school. These responsibilities will ensure safe transitions both in the morning and afternoon hours of the school day and beyond the instructional hours. September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$22,140.00; GAAP Codes: 15-421-200-110-0009-00-26, 15-421-200-110-0009-00-26.

**I. Proposal to Approve the STEM Camp Invention - Parker School.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the STEM Camp Invention - Parker School. The district received a \$12,500 donation of National Inventors' Hall of Fame STEM Programming from Nordson Corporation. Trenton students who missed the June 1st deadline for signing up with district summer programs still need enriching experiences during summer, particularly in STEM. Fifty students will attend 10 half-days of Camp Invention STEM Programming at Parker Elementary School. They will exercise creative thinking and cooperative learning grounded in STEM-based projects. The grant includes direct stipends paid directly to staff from National Inventors' Hall of Fame. July 22, 2021 through August 6, 2021. No cost to the district.

**J. Proposal to Approve the Parker School and Honor Yoga Foundation Partnership.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the Parker School and Honor Yoga Foundation Partnership. The program instructs students who display signs of trauma as well as social and emotional concerns on better coping skills. Assist in reducing discipline referrals and suspensions and help students focus in class which will in turn improve academics. Honor Yoga Foundation will provide Yoga instructions to students 40 minutes a week during their PE/Health time. September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. No cost to the district.

**K. Proposal to Approve the SBYSP - Professional Services from Mike Nelson with "Yes, You Can: 7 Keys to Student Success" Program-Trenton Central High School.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the SBYSP - Professional Services from Mike Nelson with "Yes, You Can: 7 Keys to Student Success" Program -Trenton Central High School. The program will integrate health promotion, competence building, positive youth development, preventive and supportive strategies to reduce risks and enhance protective factors for up to 60 incoming tenth graders and/or current TCHS students enrolled in summer school. The Trenton SBYSP will offer a supplemental summer support programming aimed at providing positive youth development and transitional skills support for up to 60 incoming tenth graders, entering TCHS in the fall of 2020, and/or current TCHS students enrolled in summer school. July 6, 2021 through August 18, 2021; Cost not to exceed \$3000.00. GAAP code: 20-4710-200-330-0000-210-05.

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**L. Proposal to Approve the American Red Cross Blood Drive.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the American Red Cross Blood Drive. American Red Cross will provide information on the Blood Donation Process and why it is so important for the community to donate blood. The need for blood is constant and your contribution is import for a healthy and reliable blood supply. Refreshments (ie., juice, water and donated food items) will be available to all participants. December 15, 2021. No cost to the district.

**M. Proposal to Approve the Trenton Public Schools 6-12 District Wide Summer Music Camp.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the Trenton Public Schools 6-12 District Wide Summer Music Camp. The Instrumental Music instructions will take place on the last two weeks of August 2021. Each daily session will be 4 hours in duration, teaching student instrumental music lessons as well as Marching Techniques. August 16, 2021 through August 27, 2021. Cost not to exceed \$15,120.00(\$1680.00 per teacher). GAAP code: 11-401-100-101-0009-00-81.

**N. Proposal to Approve Two Drum Line Consultants for 6-12 TCHS District Wide Marching Band.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve Two Drum Line Consultants for 6-12 TCHS District Wide Marching Band. The two Drum Line Instructors will sectionalize students into Snare Drums, Tenor, Quad Drums, Bass Drums, Cymbals, Mallet Percussionist and Timpani Musicians. The two Drum Line Drill Instructors will also choreograph with the Marching Band Director synchronized and synergized Marching Steps at 140 BPM-160BPM to Cadence the entire Marching Band. July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$11,466.00; GAAP code: 15-421-200-110-0009-00-22.

**O. Proposal to Approve TNGA Summer Scheduling 2021.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve TNGA Summer Scheduling 2021. TNGA's Scheduling Team, using student data, IEPs, and the screening process for incoming SLIFE students, will create and adjust schedules to allow for placement in classes more appropriately suited to the student needs and strengths. July 12, 2021 through August 16, 2021. Cost not to exceed \$1,680.00; GAAP code: 15-140-100-101-0009-00-04.

**P. Proposal to Approve the TNGA The H.E.R.O. Program - B.O.Y.D. Consultant.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the TNGA The H.E.R.O. Program. Students in this program participate in ten 90 minute sessions once per week. This course is designed to put young people on the path to personal growth development. Changing fixed mindsets and adopting a growth mindset. Weekly session will include but not limited to; Stereotypes and Statistics, Mastering the power of belief, Perseverance, Sacrifice, Forgiveness and much more. These sessions are designed to inform and inspire youth on topics relevant to their lives and overall development. Discussions are designed between facilitators and students to bring about understanding and changes in both perception and behavior. Facilitators and guest speakers share life experiences that stress the importance for hard work and dedication. Students also use this opportunity to role play typical day-to-day situations in business and retail stores. October 2021 through February 2022. Cost not to exceed \$ \$8,000.00; GAAP Code 15-190-100-320-0000-00-04.

**Q. Proposal to Approve AM & PM Supervision 2021-22 SY – PJ Hill School**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the AM & PM Supervision 2021-22 SY – PJ Hill School. Students in grades K-5<sup>th</sup> grade report to the cafeteria/gymnasium/corridor where they are monitored by a staff member and a cafeteria staff. Students will eat breakfast and/or be supervised prior to the start of school. September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$ 20,340.00. GAAP code: 15-421-200-110-0009-00-32.

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**R. Proposal to Approve School Attendance Committee - Harrison School**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the School Attendance Committee - Harrison School. The Attendance Committee will meet afterschool and follow up with parents regarding attendance, send follow up letters and write thank you letters to parents and students who improve their attendance. September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$1,080.00; GAAP code: 15-120-100-101-0009-00-22.

**S. Proposal to Approve AM & PM Supervision 2021-22 SY - Harrison School**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the AM & PM Supervision 2021-22 SY - Harrison School. Staff members will provide supervision during morning arrival and dismissal to ensure a safe environment for students. Staff will assist, the Lead Person in the oversight of the federally funded breakfast program and activities that lead up to the start of the instructional time. Also, staff members will supervise late-pick up students in the designated area of the school. These responsibilities will ensure safe transitions both in the morning and afternoon hours of the school day and beyond the instructional hours. September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. **T. Proposal to Approve the SMARTS online executive function curriculum-administered by Research Institute for Learning and Development - Daylight/Twilight HS.**

Implementation of the SMARTS online executive function curriculum would facilitate important metacognitive executive functioning skills—goal setting, organizing, prioritizing, thinking flexibly, remembering and self-monitoring. Students will develop social-emotional intelligence necessary for success in their homeschool and community. September 8, 2021 through June 14, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$6,694.00; GAAP code: 15-000-218-320-0000-00-35.

**U. Proposal to Approve the Nurtured Heart Project - Daylight/Twilight HS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Nurtured Heart Project - Daylight/Twilight HS. The program consists of 3 professional development sessions (2.5 hours each). Contractor will present on the Nurtures Heart Approach—a relationship-focused methodology founded in the 3 stands for helping children and adults build inner wealth and use their intensity in successful ways. September 8, 2021 through June 14, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$4,050.00; GAAP code:15-000-218-320-0000-00-35.

**V. Proposal to Approve the Yondr Program -Daylight/Twilight HS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Yondr Program -Daylight/Twilight HS. Implementation of the Yondr education program will prevent learning loss produced by distractions from cell phone usage in class. September 8, 2021 through June 14, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$9,895.00; GAAP code:15-190-100-610-0000-00-35.

**W. Proposal to Approve the Handle with Care Behavioral Management - Daylight/Twilight HS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Handle with Care Behavioral Management - Daylight/Twilight HS. Implementation of the Handle with Care Behavioral Management system will provide staff with de-escalation and physical restraint training for students that become dangerous to themselves and/or others. September 8, 2021 through June 14, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$450.00; GAAP Code:15-000-218-320-0000-00-35.

**X. Proposal to Approve the Therapy Dog Program- Daylight/Twilight HS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Therapy Dog Program- Daylight/Twilight HS. Implementation of the therapy dog program will ease anxiety in students, increase emotional well-being, and promote healing from traumatic experiences (adverse childhood experiences). September 8, 2021 through June 14, 2022. No cost to the Board.

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**Y. Proposal to Approve the HERO Program- Daylight/Twilight HS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the HERO Program- Daylight/Twilight HS. Implementation of the HERO program will put our students on the path to personal growth and development—changing fixed mindsets to growth mindsets. This program will educate, empower, and enrich the lives of our students by exposing them to all facets of creating and running a business. September 8, 2021 through June 14, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$8,000.00; GAAP code:15-000-218-320-0000-00-35.

**Z. Proposal to Approve the Faith, Fit, Forever System (F3K) - Daylight/Twilight HS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Faith, Fit, Forever System (F3K) - Daylight/Twilight HS. Students will achieve personal growth and development—changing fixed mindsets to growth mindsets—as they will learn the importance of nutrition, exercise, and good health for the overall wellbeing of the mind, body and soul. September 8, 2021 through June 14, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$9,500.00; GAAP code:15-000-218-320-0000-00-35.

**AA. Proposal to Approve the Summer Guidance Registration and Scheduling Team - Daylight/Twilight HS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Summer Guidance Registration and Scheduling Team - Daylight/Twilight HS. This team will ensure that the summer registration and course selection process deliver seamless services and that all students begin the academic school year with a high school schedule reflective of their previous academic history, reflecting correct grade and program placement for all campuses. Retrieve academic records from previous institutions to support appropriate grade level assignments and support services. Ensure that all new registrants have the appropriate immunizations and medical documentation on file. July 15, 2021 through August 31, 2021. Cost not to exceed \$10,000; GAAP code 15-000-218-104-0000-33-35

**BB. Proposal to Approve CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE PEDAGOGY THAT BUILDS CONNECTIONS FOR STUDENT SUCCESS.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the Culturally Responsive Pedagogy That Builds Connections For Student Success. The Program offers a professional development series that is virtual as COVID-19 restrictions continue to both school leaders and targeted teachers. The series will allow administrators and teachers to examine their own biases, plan for courageous conversations about the value of diversity in their own classrooms/schools and adopt culturally and linguistically instructional strategies that support academic success while valuing students' cultural wealth. The 10 sessions will consist of two parts: The first three sessions will be for 15 school leaders and the second 7 sessions will be for 40 teachers. Each session will build on the last to lay the foundation for culturally responsive pedagogy. A pre-registration and commitment to participate in all sessions will be required. September 1, 2021 to May 31, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$62,940.00; GAAP Codes: 20-245-200-300-0000-19-82, 20-245-100-101-0009-21-82, 20-245-100-610-0000-21-82.

**CC. Proposal to Approve the ELL Immigrant Student, ELL Parent and Community Engagement Initiative.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the ELL Immigrant Student, ELL Parent and Community Engagement Initiative. The ELL Immigrant Student, ELL Parent and Community Engagement Initiative is in direct alignment with the Spring 2018 ESL/Bilingual Department Needs Assessment which identified this as being an area in need of focus. The department will implement a project framework that has been highlighted in the National Education Association brief called Epstein's Framework on Parent Involvement. The department will adapt it to also ensure community stakeholder involvement and favorable impressions improve and include: assisting families with parenting skills, family support, communicating with families, learning at home, decision making, collaborating with the community, acquiring English language proficiency to support their child in school and incorporating civic education for youth in 2-8th grade. October 1, 2021 through May 31, 2022. Cost not to exceed \$51,512.00; GAAP Codes: 20-245-100-101-0009-21-82, 20-246-200-101-0009-21-82, 20-246-200-106-0009-21-82, 20-246-100-300-0000-21-82, 20-246-100-610-0000-21-82, 20-246-100-890-0000-21-82.

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**DD. Proposal to Approve Literacy Partnership between Trenton Public Schools and The College of New Jersey.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the Recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the literacy partnership between Trenton Public Schools (TPS) and The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) during the 2021-2022 school year. The purpose of this partnership is to provide research-based professional development in the area of reading to 44 teachers (24 in grades K-2 and 20 in grade 6) in order to increase student mastery of foundational reading skills in grades K - 2 and to build core and disciplinary literacy skills in grade 6 at a cost not to exceed \$104,291.20. GAAP Codes: 20-285-200-101-0009-22-82 (Supplemental Professional Development) - \$67,680.00; 11-000-221-320-0000-00-81 (Purchased Services from TCNJ) - \$36,611.20.

**EE. Proposal to Approve the 8 Mathematical Practices through Art Integration.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the 8 Mathematical Practices through Art Integration. Studies show that students gain a better understanding of mathematical principles and techniques through hands-on methodologies which are explained in new, non-traditional ways. Visual Arts teachers have participated in Professional Development sessions about "Teaching the 8 Mathematical Practices through Arts Integration" since January 2021 in preparation for this program. This program is geared towards Arts teachers working directly with Mathematics teachers to collaborate for the planning and implementation of this program. July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023; Cost not to exceed \$1,513,520.00; GAAP codes: ESSER II.

**FF. Proposal to Approve the Growing Trenton's Bilingual Staff.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve the Growing Trenton's Bilingual Staff. In Trenton, there are not enough bilingual teachers in district to service the students. To address this shortage, this program will address the staffing needs of the district by growing our pool of instructional staff with the bilingual certification/endorsement. July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023. Cost not to exceed \$205,800.00; GAAP Code ESSER II.

**GG. Proposal to Approve Grades K-2 Afterschool Enrichment\Retention Program Literacy and Numeracy Program-Literacy and Numeracy.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve Grades K-2 Afterschool Enrichment\Retention Program-Literacy and Numeracy Program-Literacy and Numeracy. Since the pandemic students attending Pre-K at identified Trenton City provider sites have not had full day classroom instruction for more than one and half years. When these Pre-K students return to in-person learning, they will be in 2nd grade, with the disadvantage of having not been in a full day school setting. When the district implements afterschool enrichment programs, lower grades are excluded from participation. It will be critical for the district in addition to the hiring 36 Learning Loss teachers, who will do daily pull outs of 5-10 students daily to have follow-up afterschool instruction for retention. September 2021 through May 2022. Cost not to exceed \$850,500.00; GAAP Code ESSER II.

**HH. Proposal to Approve Family Reading Nights.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to approve Family Reading Nights. The greatest way to instill the value of reading in students is to involve families and parents in the process. Due to the pandemic, events for parents and students have been extremely limited or only conducted in a virtual setting. This program will create an environment where students and their parents can gather to receive a new book, learn about reading strategies, questions they can ask as reading, and foster the joy of reading. One of the single greatest things that a parent can do to help their child succeed in school is read to them nightly. September 2021 through May 2022. Cost not to exceed \$51,030.00; GAAP Code ESSER II.

**II. Proposal to Approve the Division of Specialized Services and CAO Curriculum Committee to Develop Supports for Autism, Life Skills / Transition, and Behavioral Programs.**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the proposal for the Division of Specialized Services and CAO Curriculum Committee to develop supports for Autism, Life Skills/Transition, and Behavioral Programs. The committee will research and develop supplemental instructional guides and activities that focus on Special Education Programs in the areas of Autism, Life Skills/Transition, and Behavioral Strategies.

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The committee will research, develop, and write supplemental/enrichment guides to focus on a multimodal, interdisciplinary approach in addressing New Jersey Student Learning Standards in these specific areas of Special Education. July 12th, 2021 through August 20th, 2021. Cost not to exceed \$78,200.00, GAAP code 20-250-200-101-009-21-84 & 20-250-200-610-000-21-84.
