  - ▶ JJC involved and attend school in other facilities
  - ▶ Facing homelessness and attend schools in other districts

Does not include Charters, Private Schools, County Vocational Schools

# Preliminary 2020 Cohort Graduation Rates

## ▶ Accountable

▶ TPS – 62.8 (620 of 988)

▶ TCHS – 74.8 (542 of 725)

▶ DTHS – 33.5 (78 of 233)

## ▶ Attending

▶ TPS – 64.8 (581 of 897)

▶ TCHS – 78.1 (505 of 647)

▶ DTHS – 34.5 (76 of 220)

Official Rates will be published in November after approved appeals submissions are factored into the calculations



# Observations and Trends

- ▶ Slightly more students met the testing requirement via waiver because there was no Spring 2020 testing
- ▶ Non- graduates who did not attend TPS have a negative impact on district graduation rates
- ▶ DTHS serves the students who are already off-track to graduate; fewer of them will be able to graduate in 4 years
- ▶ Graduation trends should be reviewed once official data are published in November
