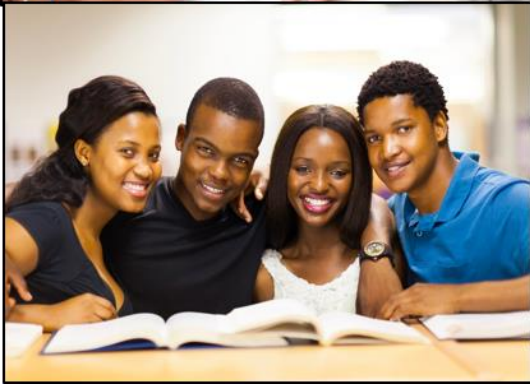

State Definitions of Acts of Violence and Vandalism



- **Assault**: A person attempts to cause or purposely, knowingly, or recklessly causes bodily injury to another.
- **Fight**: Mutual engagement in a physical confrontation that may result in bodily injury to either party. Does NOT include a verbal confrontation or shoving match.
- **Threat**: Attempting by physical menace (e.g., verbal threats) to put another in fear of future serious bodily injury.
- **Substance Possession**: A student is found with one of the reportable substance types in his or her locker or vehicle, or on his or her person.
- **Weapon Possession**: Having on one's person, in one's locker or vehicle one or more of the listed weapon types. (Handgun, Air Gun, Knife/Blade, Spray)

Highlights of HIB Law

- Can be a written, verbal or physical act or via electronic communication.
- Protected Categories:
 - Race, Color, Religion, Ancestry, National Origin, Gender, Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Expression, or a Mental, Physical or Sensory Disability, or any other Distinguishing Characteristic
- Can happen on or off school grounds.
- Substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school or the rights of others.
 - A reasonable person should know, under the circumstances, will have the effect of physically or emotionally harming a student or damaging the student's property.
 - Has the effect of insulting or demeaning a student or group of students.
 - Creates a hostile educational environment for the student by interfering with a student's education or by severely or pervasively causing physical or emotional harm to the student.



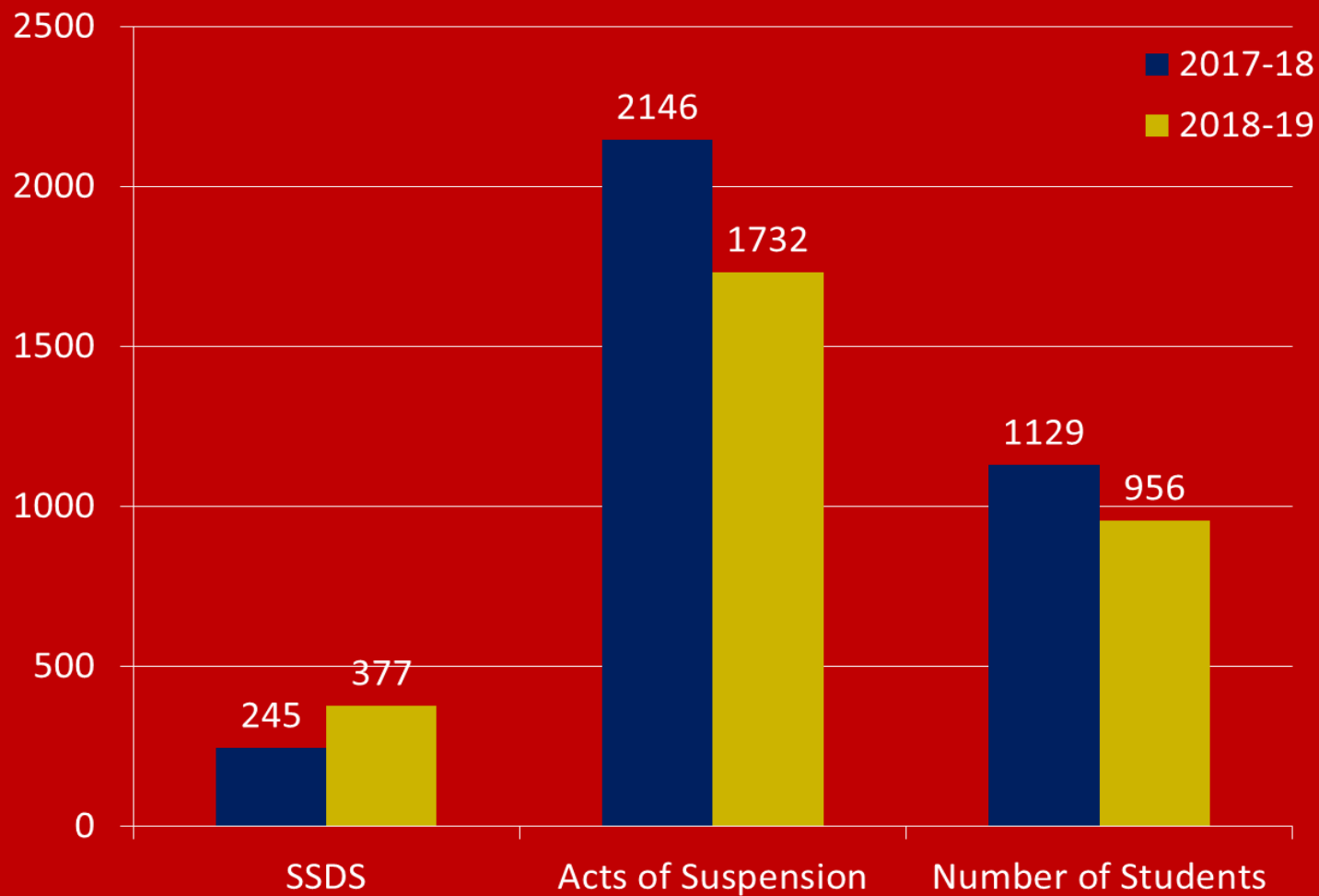


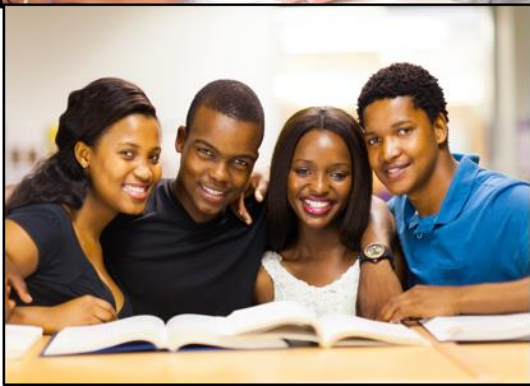
2018-19 Reported Violence and Vandalism

- 8 Confirmed HIB cases.

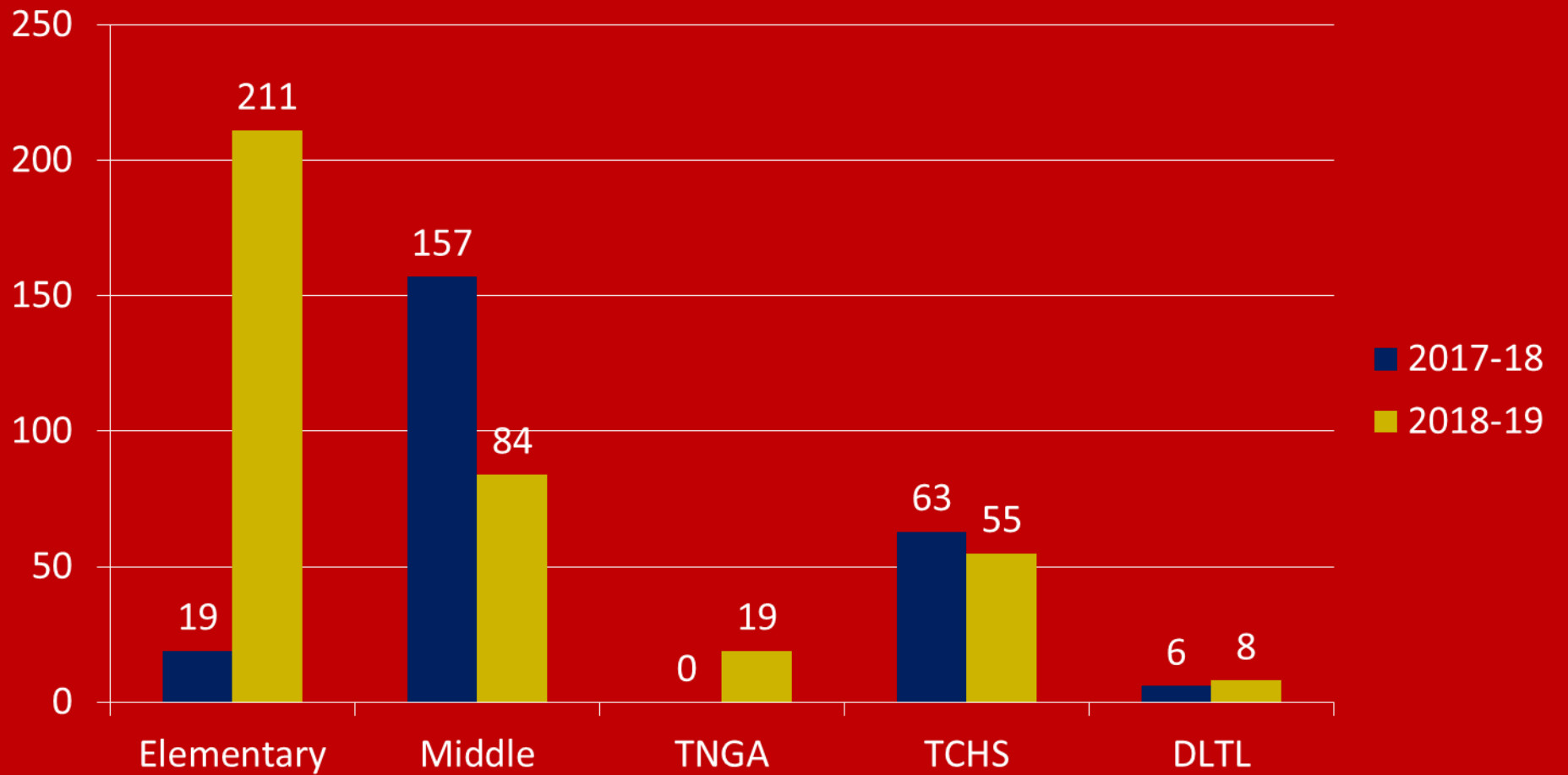


17-18 vs 18-19 Suspension Data





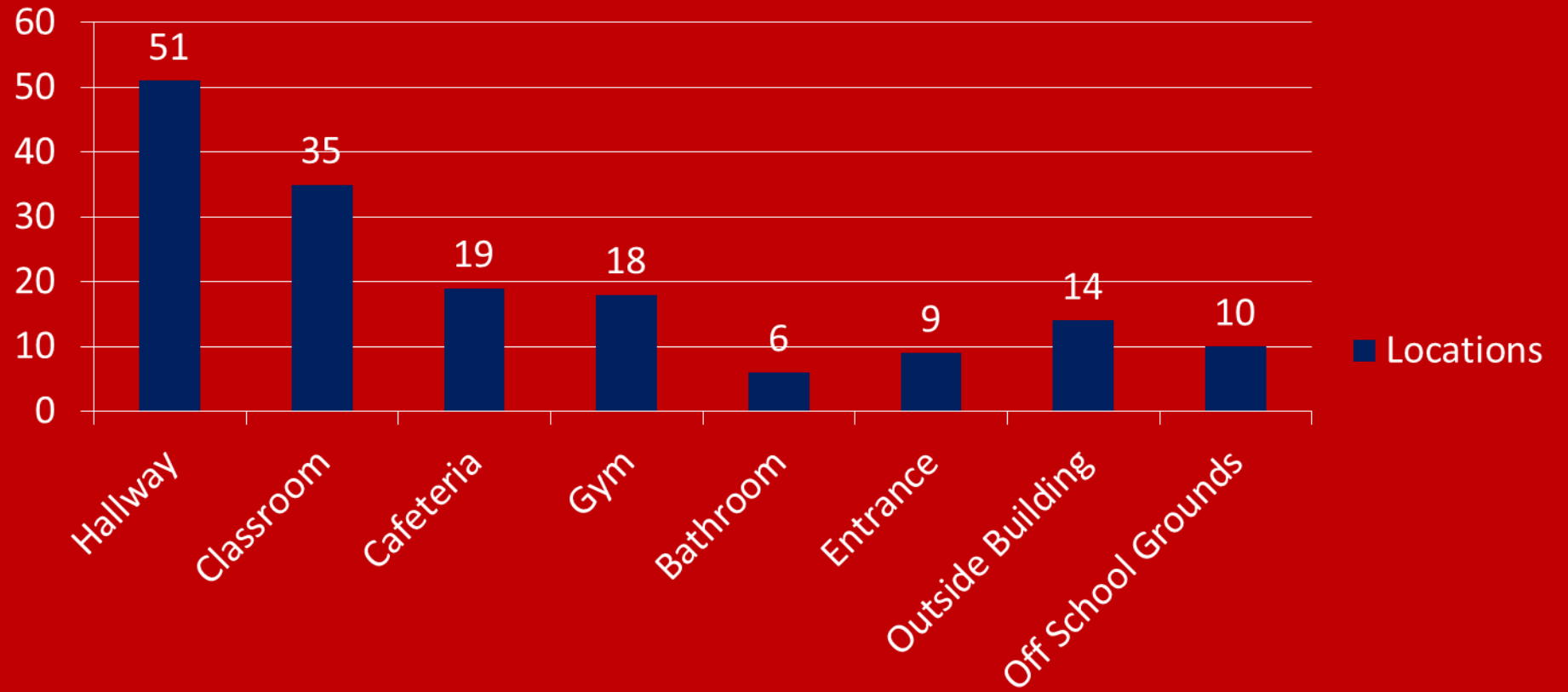
2 Year Violence & Vandalism Comparison



2018-19 Violence & Vandalism Locations

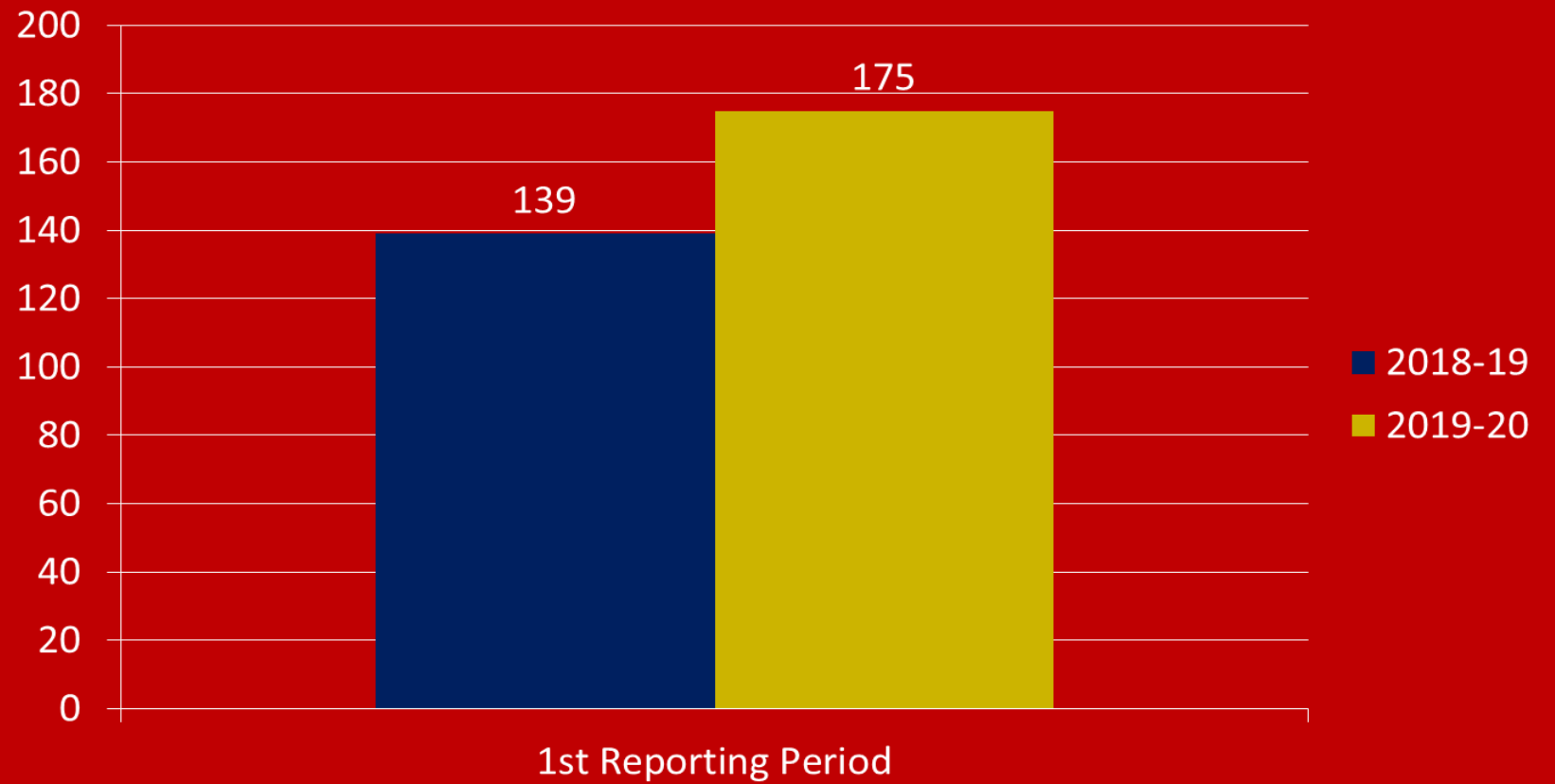

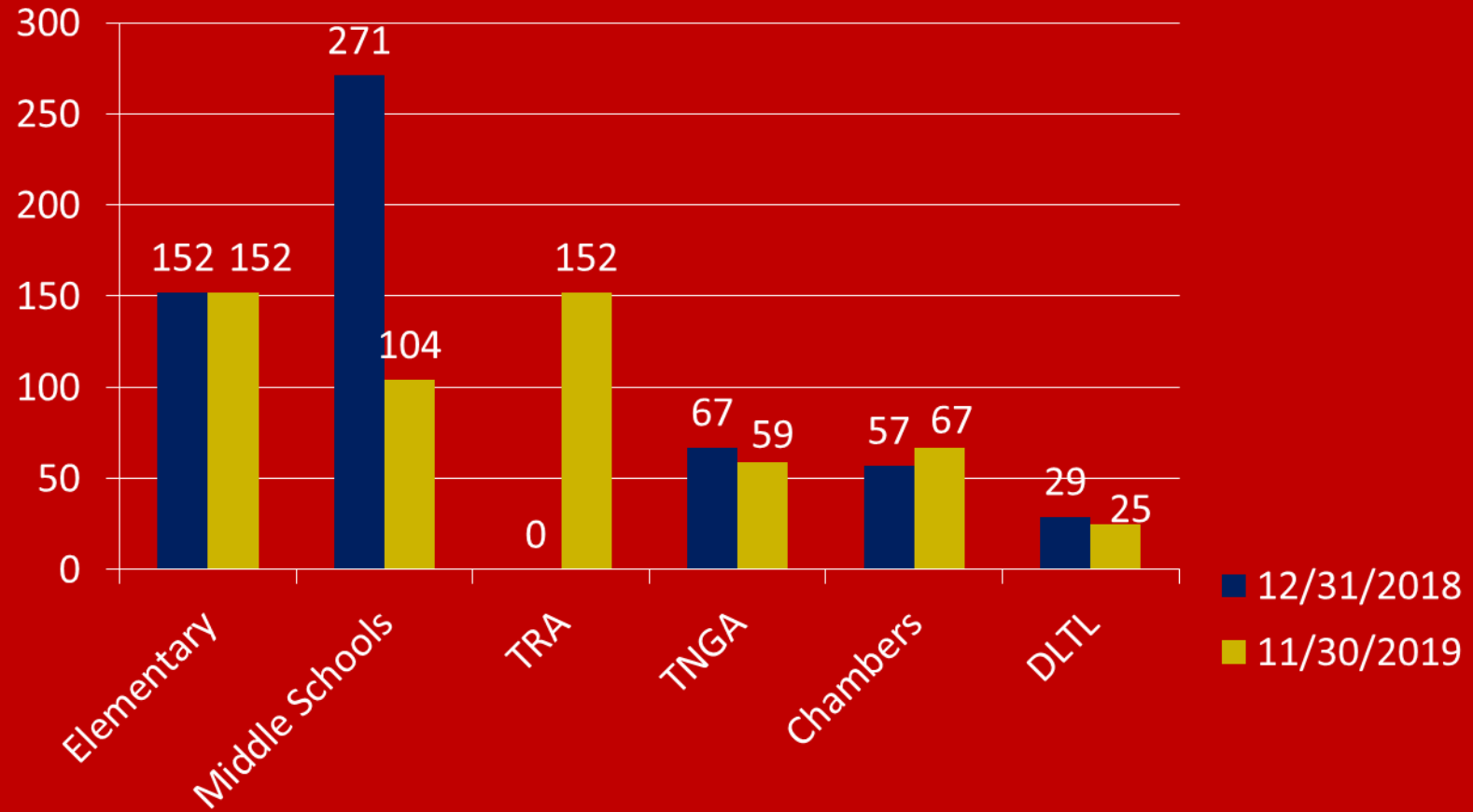
Year to Year EVVRS Comparison 1st Reporting Period

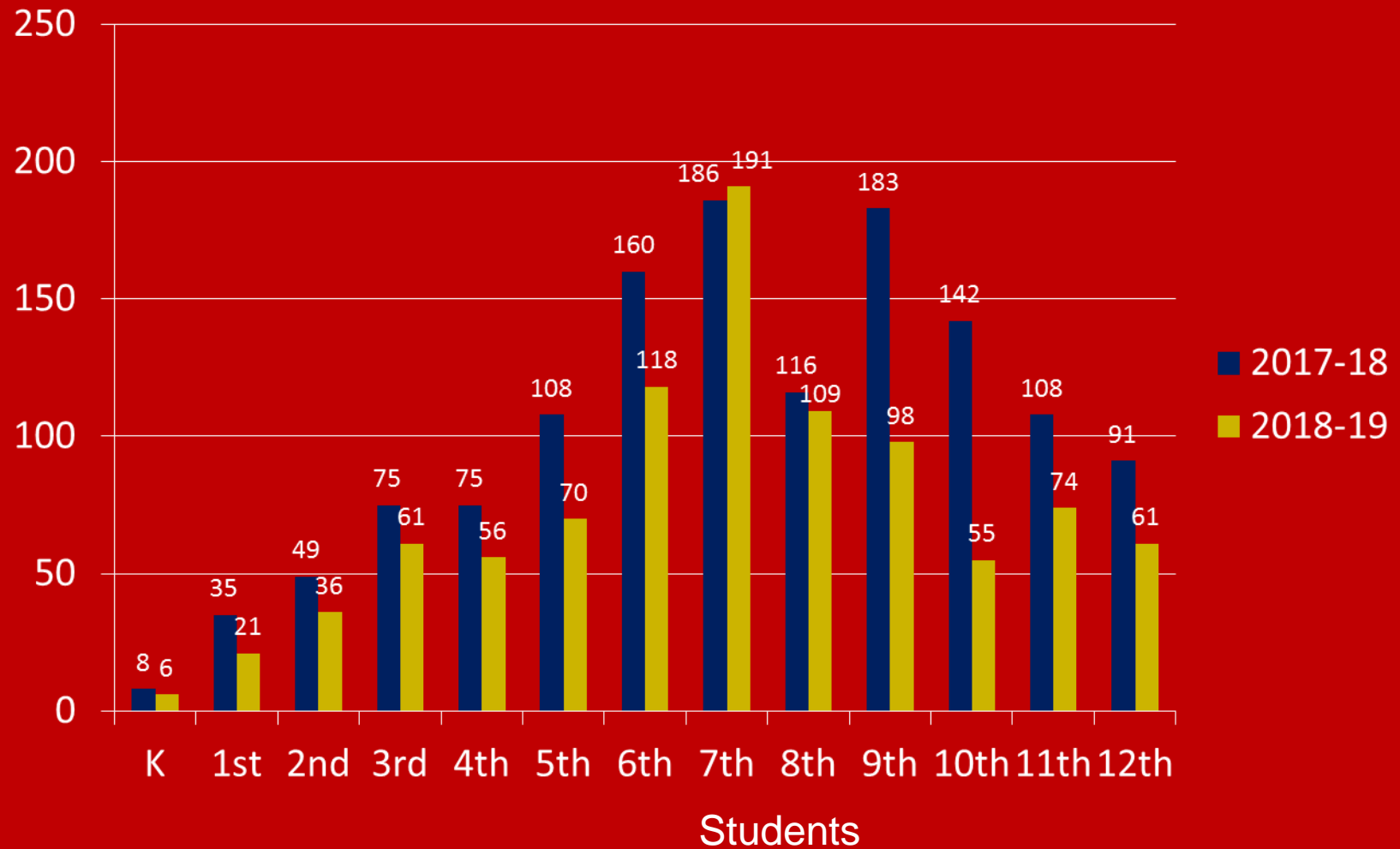


Schools Suspensions through December Comparison

K-2 Suspensions 2017-18 vs 2018-19

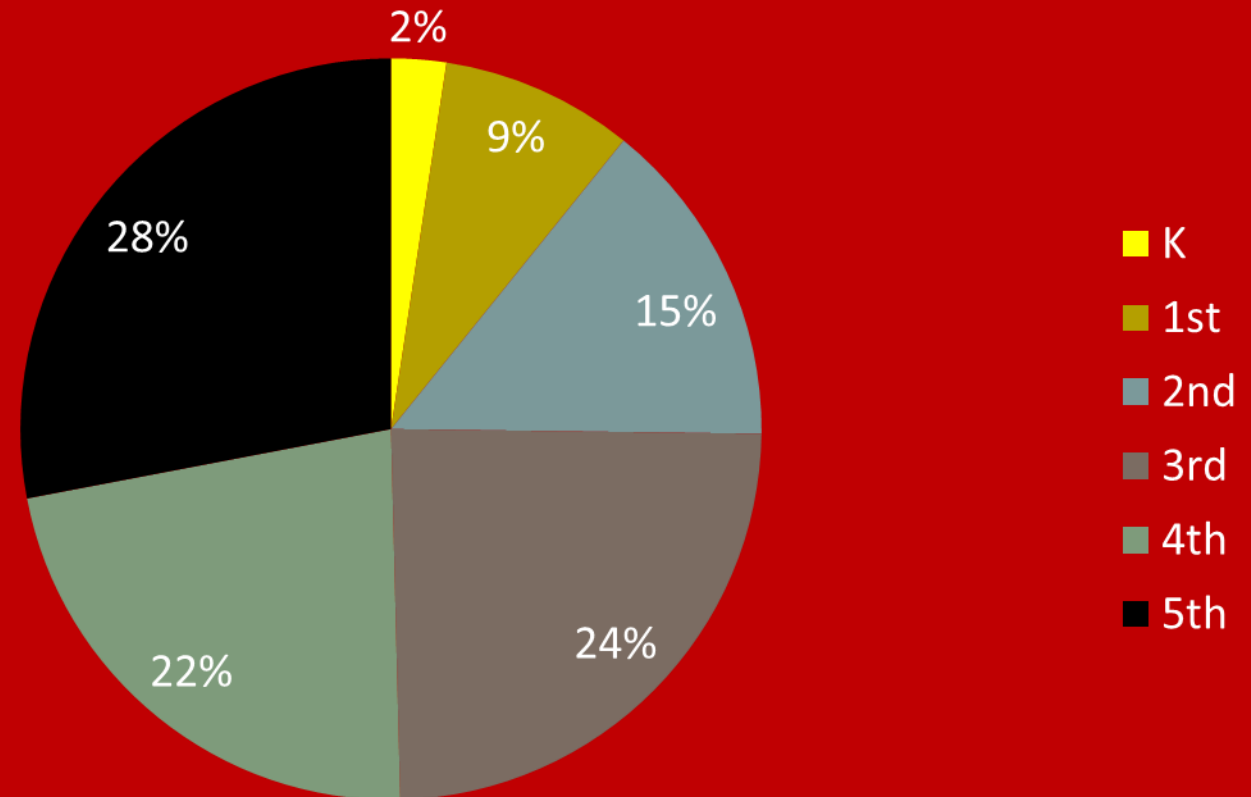

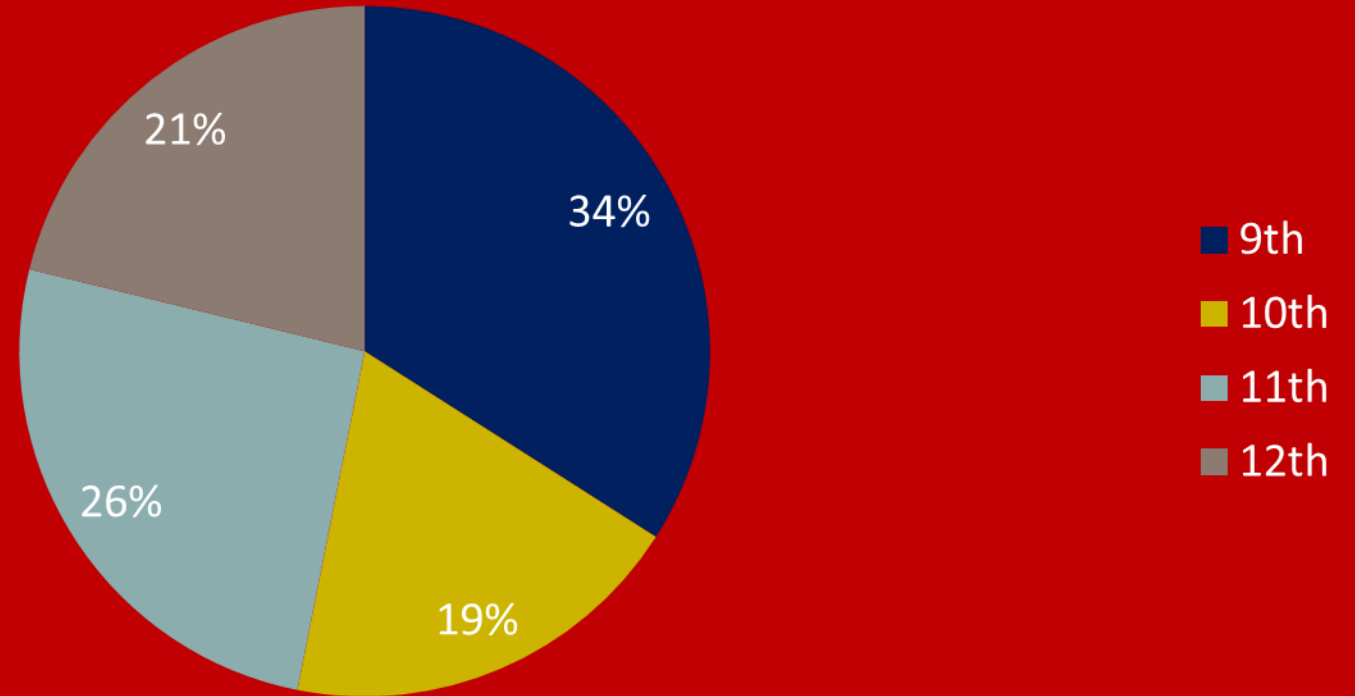

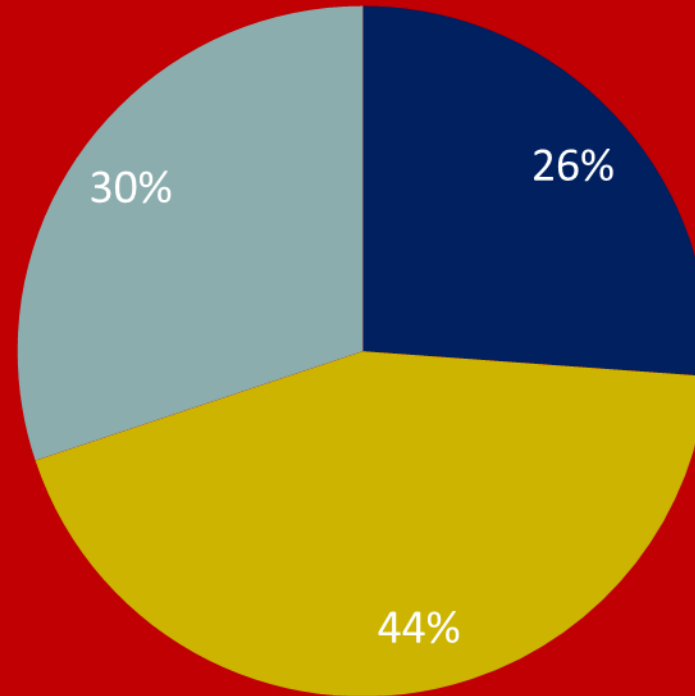
18-19 High School Suspensions

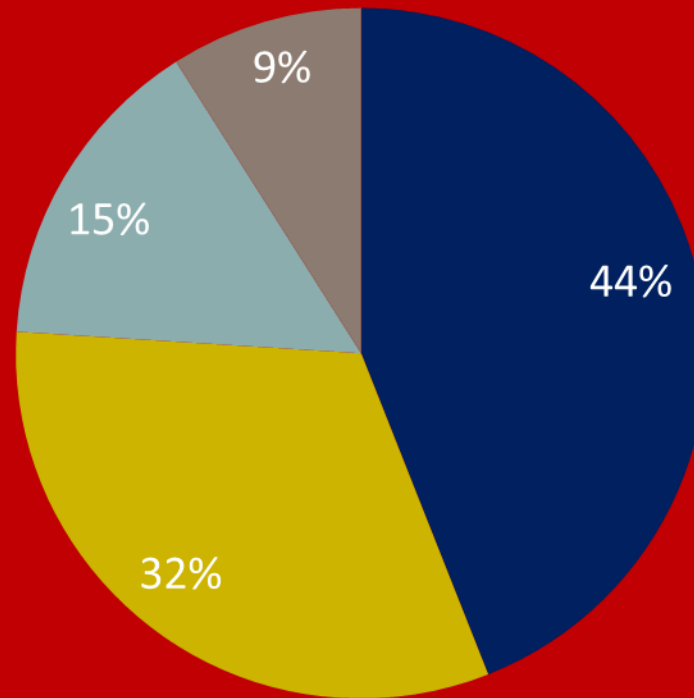
