A. Proposal to Approve The First Tee of Greater Trenton/Edward Benson-Executive Director/Robert Connelley Program Director

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the First Tee of Greater Trenton. The First Tee National School Program gives physical educators the tools they need to provide training, equipment and lesson plans that integrate golf skills, motor skills core values and healthy habits for Grades K-8; Columbus, Grant, Mott, MLK, Parker, P.J. Hill, Washington, Dunn, Hedgepeth/Williams. Fall 2018 during physical education class; no cost to the Board.

B. Proposal to Approve Dunn Middle School Color Run
